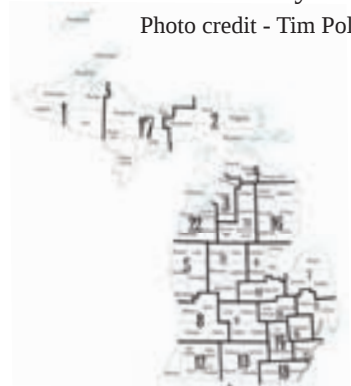

Secretary Report - Eric Eads

Well, it looks like our long summer run is coming to an end. It's the first week of November and we have our first snowfall forecast.

Enclosed in this months Michigan Rider is a copy of the ballot and by-law proposals that will be presented to the members at the Seminar in January. You must be a current ABATE member for at least 30 days to be eligible to vote. If you have any questions regarding the ballot, you can call me at 269 435-2058. (Page 23).

As a reminder, I need your Region Members of the Year by the end December, preferably sooner. I also need a list of the members who have passed in your region.

There is not much happening at the moment on the federal level regarding motorcycle, so.... lets see what's happening in Europe. What happens there tends to work its way to our shores. Proposed new drivers license requirements in the EU are greater awareness of blind spots, driver assistance systems, safe operating of doors, phone distraction, and awareness of vulnerable road users. Licenses could be valid for 15 years at the EU states discretion. If the license is used as an ID, the time frame would be 10 years. CDL type licenses would be valid for 5 years. A new or renewal of an existing license would require a medical check. Those over 65 would require more frequent medical checks. Digital licenses would gradually replace physical licenses but a physical license would still be issued if requested. If a license is suspended or restricted, all EU members would be required to report this to other EU members. The plan is to have EU members implement this plan in a 4 year time frame.

In our own backyard, Pres. Gary Kopta, thru FOIA, requested a breakdown from the State of Michigan of how the money is currently being used in the Awareness and Safety Fund that all licensed motorcyclists pay into when they renew plates and drivers licenses. This request was made back in April of this year. The request was delivered almost 6 months later. There appears to be some potential discrepancies regarding how the money is being used after going thru the 36,000 page document. If it is found the money is not being used as intended, we will take the appropriate action. Stay tune for future developments.

Lee Ramey, and Johnny Rotten became Life Members. Lee Ramey also contributed to the Legislative fund. Thanks for everything you all do.

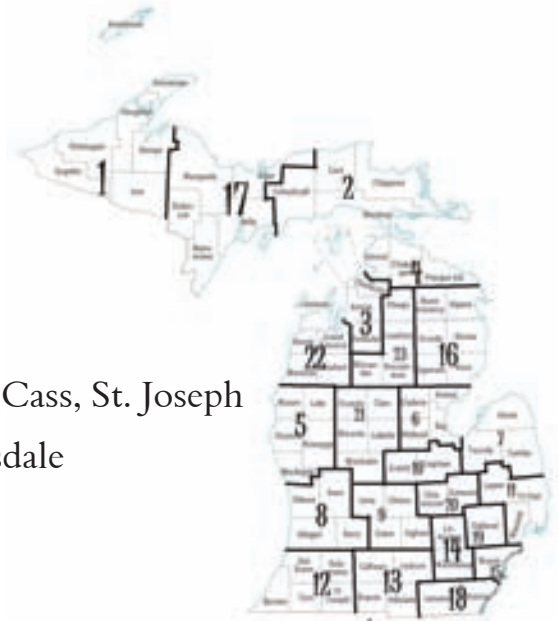

Tesla recently launched a new mode, dubbed "Mad Max". This allows vehicles to weave through traffic and move more confidently. NHTSA had previously rejected this tech.

Region 19's November Meeting went well and was enjoyed by all. It was not until the next day that we learned the bad news. Let's take things in the order that they occurred.

At 6:00p we placed our orders for Shark Club vittles and were excited to welcome ABATE members Oscar and Patty from Region 11 who had traveled south to visit. Their

mission was both to share information from ABATE's recent Board Meeting and just to visit. Oscar is acting-RC for Region 11, following the death of Richard Snooks in 2024. Oscar is great guy and is working hard in one of ABATE's most active Regions. Hess has worked with Oscar in Lansing and has great respect for him and the leadership that he is providing for his Region. Patty is a stand-out LO from Region 11, and also shared her views on ABATE issues. Our visitors talked about:

- The importance of effective communication between ABATE's state-level leaders and the Regions, something which we must all work to improve. Region and state leaders must work together more closely to help achieve ABATE's goals.

- There is support on ABATE's Board for cash prizes for ABATE's 2026 fund-raising raffle. It is thought that it will be easier to sell tickets for cash prizes than for a motorcycle. Region 19 folks were in general agreement.

- We were thrilled that Oscar and Patty had come to visit. Region 19 cordially invites ABATE members from any Region to come to our meetings.

When dinner was finished and our guests had left, Bill called our meeting to order. Bill spoke about the following items:

Operations Officer Woody Berg has asked Regions to post relevant news about local Region activities on Facebook.

- Bill reported that Oakland County has about 50 active members but only 8 to 12 regularly attending meetings. Given Oakland County's population, these are truly disappointing numbers.

- Bill opened nominations for next year's officers. Bill (RC) and Speedy (Treasurer) were elected unanimously. Hess was also reelected as LO but even though no one was running against him, the voting was very close; Hess won by only a single vote. Hess later said that he was surprised he had won.

- Bill then gave his MRF Report:

1. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has begun to investigate Tesla because its "Full Self-Driving System" fails to obey basic traffic laws.

2. Our LO commented: "It's about time!! Tesla's failure-prone system has injured or killed many of its users and has endangered, injured and killed motorcyclists and other innocents. All the while, Tesla has continued to foist this system on its customers and the general public. Tesla should be ashamed and remove this system from its

products!"

3. ABATE President Gary Kopta is gathering information through FOIA requests regarding how Michigan spends money raised through motorcycle license fees. Details to follow.

4. Region Realignment: ABATE is considering a new system of Regions across the state. The goal is to improve efficiency in leadership and participation of members. Discussion continues with a vote likely to take place at the Board Meeting during January's Seminar.

- Hess then distributed his LO Report and led a brief discussion regarding:

5. The continuing saga of ABATE's efforts to overturn the worst effects of 2019's SB 1.

6. The threats presented by legislation introduced in July to address insurance fraud in our state. House Bills 4713-4719 would increase both criminality and penalties for fraudulent insurance claims made in the state. But there is concern because such laws might make it easier to accuse injured bikers of fraud when they make completely legitimate medical claims.

7. HB 5030, a bill that would allow (or require?) auto insurance companies to offer PIP coverage with deductible as part of their car insurance policies. Dondi has spoken vehemently against this idea.

It was a great meeting but bad news came the next day. Dave Buchanan (one of our regular attendees) died in his sleep on the night of November 4th. Dave served in the Marine Corps in the late 1960s and in civilian life became a fire-fighter, a musician, a master guitar technician and a great friend. He worked in the Auburn Hills Department of Public Works for many years and in retirement at Motor City Guitar in Waterford. Dave was a friend and riding companion who enjoyed a life-long motorcycle career that included riding home from California on his then-new

1970 BSA Lightning following his discharge from the Marine Corps. Dave owned that bike all his adult life and sold it only a few weeks ago. Dave also rode hundreds of thousands of miles on Harleys, Gold Wings and more recently on his beloved Indians. Without Dave there will always be an empty chair at Region 19's meetings.

Why ABATE Still Matters: Fighting for Bikers, Building Brotherhood.
