In Lansing we do have a bill for lane splitting in the Senate. Not much movement yet but I am sure Bear





On November 11th, Speaker Mike Johnson ordered all

Representatives to get to Washington for a vote on the government shutdown. At the time, many flights were unavailable due to air traffic controller staff shortages.
