I know I have mentioned a couple of the RC's that have stepped up in the dormant Regions but I am going to mention all the RC's that have taken over the position, both elected RC's, and those that have stepped up in the dormant regions, in the last 3 months.

Region 2 Travis Graham, Region 3 Van Dunson, Region 4 Dave Etherton, Region 5 Cindy Gizmo Meloche, Region 13 Dan Kenzie, Region 15 Bobby Prine, Region 19 Bill Stewart, and Region 21 Craig A Brown. I want to thank you all for giving a shit and taking time out of your lives to do what you feel is the right thing to do. If we don't protect our right to ride, we will not only lose that right, the powers that be will be going after our other rights. Thanks to all the RC's, and members of ABATE who work hard to keep our freedoms in place. I know it ain't easy, and sometimes its a thankless job but we do what needs to be done. I would suggest if you haven't been to a meeting in a while, to attend one and see whats going on. Riding season is upon us so that's an excuse to go for a ride an attend a meeting. I am sure some of the new RC's would welcome any kind of help or assistance you can offer to make their Region the best!

A quick reminder about the free 3500 ADD Insurance. The day you become an ABATE Member you have the insurance. You don't have to sign the enclosed card. If you sign the card and mail it in, you will be contacted to see if you are interested in purchasing any more of AIL's insurance products. If you are interested in checking out more of their products, sign the card and mail it in. If you do not want more insurance, throw the card in the trash. You will still have the 3500 free ADD insurance. We have had a good relationship with AIL over the past 10 years. They have paid out over 100K to ABATE of Michigan families. If you any issues with the insurance, call me and I will take care of it. ABATE makes 0.00 dollars with

this program We offer it as a benefit of being an ABATE member. The MRF and numerous other State ABATE's offer this program as well.

combustion engines

by 2035, with more states expected to follow. If this concerns you, I found one EV bike called an Evoke that has a claimed range of 410 miles. It will set you back 25K which is a pretty good deal based on its range and performance. With a fast charger it will charge in 30 minutes. If you charge it at home it will take 12 hours. Most EV bikes have a range between 100 to 150 miles and a higher price. If you don't want to pay big bucks for an EV bike, join the MRF, email your representative and tell them your concerns. We cant sit on our ass and hope things will go our way. Now more than ever it's important all motorcyclists work together for our common goals. That's the only way we can stop all impending and proposed legislation to legislate us into extinction. In case you have forgot, the EPA will require all 67% of all new cars in 7 -1/2 years to be electric.

The ability to get you motorcycle repaired is getting more difficult if your bike is more than 10 years old. Harley stopped production of carburetor bikes in 2007 and will no longer adjust your carburetor. The same holds true with your older fuel injected bike. Harley will no longer tune your fuel injected bike and no longer supplies ECU's under threat of fines from the EPA. Aftermarket suppliers are restricted on sales of injection modules as well. All this in the name of cleaner air. The problem is that the EPA refuses to list an emission standard for dealers and aftermarket suppliers so they can build the components that would comply with EPA emissions. It is going to get harder and harder to get parts and have the ability to get your bike repaired in the near future unless we make our voices heard. Contact your US Senator or Congressman and let them know you want the ability to maintain your motorcycle!

E15 has expanded by the EPA to year round sales in 8 Midwestern states starting in 2025. Prior to this ruling E15 could only be sold between the months of June 1st and September 15th. The EPA said this ruling will help with potential supply disruptions due to the war in Ukraine. ABATE of Michigan is currently working on a program tailored after ABATE of Indiana's BAG program; Biker Approved Gas. If a gas station sells the correct fuel for your motorcycle, we would give them a sticker and promote them in the Michigan Rider and on the website. This would let motorcyclists know where they can get the correct fuel for their bike, and keep them from violating federal law by mis-fueling their bike with E15. Make sure


As you may have heard, after decades of trying to change the mandatory helmet law, Nebraska is now a free choice state for those over 21. I love it when we the people get to make our own decisions!

6 REASONS WHY YOU NEED TO KEEP AN EYE OUT FOR MOTORCYCLISTS WHEN DRIVING

Year round, bumper stickers and billboards encourage us to watch out for motorcycles on the road. And with good reason! Motorcycles are a high-risk category of vehicles, and accidents can be fatal. As Spring and Summer approach, it's even more important to be aware of motorcyclists on the road. And here's why.

1. THEY'RE EASIER TO HIT.

Motorcycles are some of the most vulnerable drivers on the road. By the nature of their choice of vehicle, motorcycles are smaller and easier to miss. They move quickly and can blend into the pavement, so they're at a much higher risk for being in an accident.

2. CRASHES ARE OFTEN FATAL.

Accidents on motorcycles are more likely to be fatal for the rider. Without the protection of air bags or bodywork, collisions almost never occur without causing injury to the rider.

3. CARS ARE USUALLY THE ONES IN THE WRONG.

More likely than not, if there's an accident between a motorcycle and a vehicle, it's typically the driver who made the mistake. Motorcycles are harder to see than other cars, and their size makes it easy to be surprised by them. When you check your blind spots, you're unconsciously looking for cars, not bikes. Remember that when you're driving near a motorcycle, you're more likely to make a mistake than the rider is, so be careful.

4. IT'S HARD TO TELL HOW FAST THEY'RE GOING.

It's easy to misjudge the distance of an oncoming motorcycle. If you're turning left, you may assume that the motorcycle coming toward you from the other direction is going slow enough that you can clear the intersection, but motorcycles are much faster and lighter than cars, so your mental calculation for the distance is likely to be inaccurate. Intersections are a common site of accidents for this reason, be extra cautious when judging distance and speed.

5. MOTORCYCLES CAN BRAKE MUCH FASTER.

Because they weigh so little, a motorcycle can decelerate much quicker than a car. If you're driving too close to a motorcycle, and the bike brakes quickly you may not be able to react in time. Always leave plenty of following room.

6. IT'S MORE DANGEROUS AT NIGHT.

Like all driving, the risk goes up when there's less light to see by. This is especially true with motorcycles, which often only have one headlight. For drivers used to seeing two lights, you may overlook a single headlight or mistake it for part of the landscape. Be double alert for motorcycles on the road when it's dark out.

The next time you hit the road, keep your head up and remain alert for motorcycles on the road, and remember to increase your following room when you're driving behind one. Stay safe, and drive carefully! *Written by Big Al.*



May is Motorcycle Awareness Month

May is Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month. This event spreads safety information about motorcycles on the road. As the weather gets warmer, the number of those driving motorcycles will increase, all drivers on the road must be more aware of their surroundings to prevent accidents.

BE VISIBLE.

Use your headlight day and night so you are easier to see.

GIVE YOURSELF SPACE.

Drive defensively by giving yourself time and distance to account for other motorists' driving.

STAY IN YOUR LANE.

Make sure to remain in your lane. Do not weave in and out of lanes.

WATCH THE WEATHER.

When riding, make sure you have a plan of action if bad weather occurs.

OTHER MOTORISTS

Always LOOK TWICE - SAVE A LIFE. Before changing lanes, check to make sure you didn't miss a motorcyclist who could have been in your blind spot.

USE CAUTION

When passing or changing lanes, make sure there is enough room to do so.

PAY ATTENTION

Pay attention while driving at night for motorcycles; they are smaller, so they may not be as easy to see as a car.

KEEP A SAFE DISTANCE

When driving behind motorcycles—or any other vehicle ensure you have enough space to stop safely if an accident or problem occurs.

DRIVE DEFENSIVELY

Always drive defensively to avoid accidents and account for other drivers' actions.
