## **About the Training**

Successful completion of this training will result in a RiderCoach certification through the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF). The MSF is a nationally recognized program that has provided the curriculum followed by all motorcycle-safety-training providers in the state of Michigan.

This training is approximately 90 hours in length. You will learn to teach the MSF's Basic RiderCourse (BRC) and the Basic RiderCourse 2 (BRC2) using adult-learning principles. The course will begin with RiderCoach Trainer led instruction and assignments. Once the material has been covered, you'll practice teaching in the classroom and range exercises with your fellow RiderCoach candidates. At the conclusion of the training, you will student-teach both a BRC and a BRC2.

## **RiderCoach Requirements**

- Be 18 years of age or older.
- Pass a criminal background check.
- Possess a valid driver license and motorcycle (CY) endorsement for a minimum of one (1) year.
- Have a personal driving record with no more than six (6) moving-violation points during the 12 consecutive months before submitting this application.
- Successfully complete a Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) RiderCoach Preparation Course.
- Be physically capable of standing on pavement in various weather conditions for extended periods of time; this includes rain, snow, and extreme heat.

### **Other aspects taken into consideration:**

- The candidate is an active motorcyclist with considerable street-riding miles each year.
- The candidate is committed to all aspects of motorcyclist safety, motorcycle-safety education, and the MSF RiderCoach Rules of Professional Conduct.
- The candidate shows evidence of strong presentation skills.
- The candidate has committed to the sponsoring program with a willingness to work a minimum of four (4) classes per season for a minimum of three (3) years, he or she meets the needs of the recommending sponsor, and he or she represents the program in a courteous and professional manner.
- The candidate must demonstrate range exercises with his or her own motorcycle on the day that involves BRC2 student teaching.

### Acceptance

To apply, fill out the RiderCoach Preparation application form and return it to the contact person listed at the end of the application.

Once received, you will be contacted for a brief phone interview.

Participants for the RiderCoach Preparation Course are determined by **Selective Admission**. If you are accepted into the program, you will receive written notification approximately six weeks prior to the start of the training, if applicable.

*If you are selected and accept this opportunity:*

- You will be asked to register and pay a \$75 course fee.
- You will be provided the course materials and pre-course assignment after paying the course fee.
- You must volunteer to assist in a Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) Basic RiderCourse (BRC) or Basic RiderCourse 2 (BRC2) class prior to starting the RiderCoach Preparation. This opportunity will allow you to work alongside certified RiderCoaches to gain a better understanding of the curriculum, class flow, and physical demands of the position. Class schedules are available upon request.

### Preparation

You will receive the pre-course assignment along with your RiderCoach Guide prior to the start of your training—this assignment must be completed before you arrive to your first class session.

This is an intensive training that covers a lot of material in a short period of time—it is both physically and mentally demanding. Please be prepared to ride every day and study in your off-hours. Required riding gear includes a DOT-certified helmet; long-sleeved shirt or jacket; long pants; eye protection (required even with face shield); full-finger gloves; and boots (must cover ankle & have a hard sole).

### Successful Completion

In order to successfully complete the training, you must:

- **Attend 100% of the time.** Before submitting an application, please check your personal calendar and verify you are available to attend all dates and times.
- Complete and submit all homework, written and range design & layout assignments.
- Be evaluated using objective criteria. Two (2) overall unsatisfactory scores will constitute dismissal from the program.
- Take a written final exam (50 multiple-choice questions) and score 80% or better.

# MOTORCYCLE SAFETY 2022 REGIONAL SCHEDULE

## **BASIC RIDERCOURSE (BRC) - WEB ENHANCED | BEGINNING RIDERS**

This course is designed for someone who has little or no experience operating a motorcycle, and it focuses on the development of basic riding skills: clutch and throttle coordination, straight-line riding, braking, turning, and shifting. **Training motorcycles are provided.** Privately owned motorcycles are **NOT** permitted. The course also provides a fast track to *motorcycle endorsement* (CY); successful completion results in a certificate that waives the written knowledge test and riding-skill test, which would otherwise be administered by the Secretary of State and a third-party testing agency, respectively.

Instruction consists of approximately 18 total hours – 3 hours of online preparation to be completed prior to your class start date, 5 hours of classroom instruction, 8 hours of hands-on training, and 2 hours of evaluation and testing.

**Weekend BRC students need to be available, but not necessarily on-site, for all of Saturday and Sunday.** Students are placed into groups during classroom instruction on Friday; those in *Group A* will ride in the morning (8am-1pm), and those in *Group B* will ride in the afternoon (1pm-6pm). While we do our best to accommodate requests, please keep in mind that we cannot guarantee placement into either specified group. Please reserve any requests for your instructor on Friday.

### **Prerequisites**

- Ability to ride a bicycle.
- Valid email address on file with the community college at which you registered. Must complete the online eCourse prior to your class start date and bring the completion certificate to the first class session. The link to the eCourse will be distributed via email at least one week prior to the start date of your class. If you have not received an email by this time, you must contact the community college at which you registered.

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## **BASIC RIDERCOURSE 2 (BRC2) | EXPERIENCED RIDERS**

This course is designed mainly for experienced but unendorsed motorcyclists; however, endorsed motorcyclists also use this course to refresh their skills. Topics include: braking, countersteering, turning, speed judgment, and other techniques necessary for the experienced rider to operate a motorcycle skillfully and safely. **Students must provide their own motorcycle.** Mopeds are welcome. Three-wheeled motorcycles are **NOT** permitted. Sharing is **NOT** permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; and it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, and the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection. The course also provides a fast track to *motorcycle endorsement* (CY); successful completion results in a certificate that waives the written knowledge test and riding-skill test, which would otherwise be administered by the Secretary of State and a third-party testing agency, respectively.

### **Prerequisites**

- Prior motorcycling experience.
- Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, and insured.
- Valid email address on file with the community college at which you registered.

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## **ADVANCED RIDERCOURSE (ARC) | EXPERIENCED, ENDORSED RIDERS**

This course is designed for experienced, endorsed motorcyclists to enhance their basic skills and help with personal risk assessment. Interactive classroom activities to improve perception and hazard awareness are combined with range exercises that enhance both basic skills and crash-avoidance skills. You will also learn how to improve braking and cornering finesse. This is the public version of the Military SportBike RiderCourse. **Students must provide their own motorcycle.** Mopeds are **NOT** permitted. Three-wheeled motorcycles are **NOT** permitted. Sharing is **NOT** permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; and it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, and the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection.

### **Prerequisites**

- Motorcycle endorsement.
- Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, and insured.
- Considerable street-riding miles.
- Valid email address on file with the community college at which you registered.

### Basic RiderCourse 2 (BRC2) | Experienced Riders

This course is designed mainly for experienced but unendorsed motorcyclists; however, endorsed motorcyclists also use this course to refresh their skills. Topics include: braking, countersteering, turning, speed judgment, and other techniques necessary for the experienced rider to operate a motorcycle skillfully and safely. **Students must provide their own motorcycle.** Mopeds are welcome. Three-wheeled motorcycles are **NOT** permitted. Sharing is **NOT** permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; and it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, and the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection. The course also provides a fast track to *motorcycle endorsement* (CY); successful completion results in a certificate that waives the written knowledge test and riding-skill test, which would otherwise be administered by the Secretary of State and a third-party testing agency, respectively.

#### Prerequisites

- Prior motorcycling experience.
- Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, and insured.
- Valid email address on file with the College.
