A Message from Your HOA President

Dear Ironwood Village Neighbors,

Spring is here, bringing warm days and beautiful weather before the summer heat sets in. I hope you're all enjoying this wonderful time of year in our community.

For those who couldn't attend our Annual Meeting, I'm pleased to share that the overall message was positive. The Scottsdale Police Department provided an incident report, confirming that all issues reported were isolated, with no ongoing concerns in Ironwood Village. The most common issue involved internet fraud. Please remain vigilant—avoid sharing personal information over the phone and be cautious with financial requests. Attendance at the Annual Meeting was primarily virtual, with only one resident attending in person. Given this, the Board of Directors is evaluating whether to continue reserving a physical meeting space or transition entirely to Zoom for future meetings.

On the project front, we are wrapping up Phase I of our Irrigation Upgrade project, an important step in maintaining efficient water use. Additionally, we are preparing to upgrade the entrance signs for our sub-communities and have begun the vendor selection process for the ongoing Common Wall Maintenance project.

Another key update involves a collaboration with the City of Scottsdale to enhance the bridge railings in our community. This project will replace the existing wooden posts with custom-built metal ones that preserve the current aesthetic. The best part? This upgrade is fully funded by the city and will be completed in phases.

Lastly, we are forming the Good Neighbor Ad-Hoc Committee to help address potential issues with properties owned by absentee landlords. As always, we encourage residents to get involved—your participation is vital in keeping Ironwood Village a thriving, well-maintained community.

Thank you for your continued support and engagement. Together, we make Ironwood Village a fantastic place to call home.

Understanding Ironwood Village's Exterior Lighting Guidelines

Recently, the Board has received concerns regarding exterior lighting in our community. To ensure clarity, here's a quick overview of the guidelines designed to balance safety, aesthetics, and our "dark sky" community standards.

Holiday Lighting

- Holiday decorations may be displayed up to 30 days before the holiday.
- All decorations must be removed within 14 days after the holiday.

Home Exterior Lighting

- Outdoor lighting should only illuminate your property—not neighboring homes or common areas.
- Use low-wattage bulbs and install fixtures that blend with the home's architecture.
- Security lighting, including motion-activated floodlights, must be:
 - Installed under eaves and no higher than 12 feet.
 - Shielded to prevent light from shining on neighboring properties.
 - o Painted to match the home's exterior.

Floodlights cannot be installed on the front of the home and are not a substitute for garage carriage lights.

Neighborhood Safety & Security

Ironwood Village does not have streetlights, as we follow "dark sky" principles. To improve visibility and security.

- Homeowners are encouraged to leave low-wattage (250 lumens max) front porch and driveway lights on overnight.
- Lights should be on timers or photocells to turn on and off automatically.
- If you do not have driveway carriage lights, you may submit a request to install them.

By following these guidelines, we can maintain the character of our community while ensuring safety and compliance for all residents.


