As our homes age and require updating, please take the time to complete the Ironwood Village architectural form when making changes. This form is located under the FORMS tab on our https://ironwoodvillage.com/.

The architectural committee, which approves these forms, meets once a month on the second Wednesday and requires forms to be submitted by noon that Monday. The most common requests we see are painting, roof repair, front door upgrades, landscaping, and window replacement. Our community has created other requirements over the years based on feedback from owners and professional architects.
