Dear Champaign County Voter,

This election you have two contradictory choices: 1) whom to select for Auditor and 2) whether to eliminate the position entirely *and to forever give up your choice of Auditor*.

Last December, I opposed the **doubling** of the so-called <u>Public Safety Sales Tax</u> (PSST). I proved <u>that it's unneeded</u>. When I presented this good news to the County Board, they vociferously <u>resisted</u>, instead coveting the additional \$7 million dollars the tax would raise.

I have shed partisanship to the point of confronting my fellow Democrats: the Treasurer, the County Board majority, and the County Executive. The professional oath I've sworn as a CPA to uphold objectivity means more to me than pleasing any local party organization.

My opponent, meanwhile, is a wandering minstrel of election denialism. He spends his days 'poll-watching' the vote-by-mail center and pestering the County Clerk's staff. Without a working knowledge of finance, he'd rather audit your ballot than the uses to which your tax dollars are put.
