## Entity Planning: Process, Nature/Effect/Options/Recommendations of Trends

### Process

The plan was developed with input from the Board of Commissioners and membership of Las Acequias de Placitas Water Cooperative (LAdP) at public meetings. Because of the disastrous summer and fall 2018 (more fully described in Factors/Trends Considered), at its general membership meeting on January 21, 2019, an Infrastructure Committee was formed, which prepared an Emergency Infrastructure Plan (EIP). At a general membership meeting on January 25, 2019, the EIP was adopted, as amended at a general membership meeting on May 31, 2019. The projects were prioritized first to increase efficiency of the current system by replacing an unusable water storage tank, installing required fencing and customer and leak detection meters (to be completed in FY20) and then connecting springs together and replacing 75 year-old water lines (FY 21, 22 and 23). Las Acequias also prioritized researching and acquiring a suitable location and planning and designing an emergency backup water well for the domestic system (to be completed in FY20). Construction of the backup well has been prioritized for FY 21.

### Goals

The entity's overall capital improvement goals are to ensure a sustainable water supply both for domestic use and irrigation by increasing efficiency and locating and installing an emergency backup water source for domestic use.

### Factors/Trends Considered

Las Acequias de Placitas Water Cooperative (LAdP) is in an infrastructure emergency.

LAdP is one of only three hybrid domestic water/acequia systems in New Mexico. It serves approximately 180 households (400 residents, many elderly and/or low income) in the Village of Placitas in Sandoval County. It is a spring-fed system, dependent on winter snowpack on the north side of the Sandia Mountains. For nearly six months in 2018, because of almost no snow pack the previous winter, the springs dramatically reduced their output to the point that the domestic water system was under ongoing boil advisories and had to be shut off 16 hours every day. There was little to no irrigation water. Predictions of the imminent demise of El Nino and the rise of La Nina suggest another dry winter followed by a low-flow summer is soon likely. Because of climate change, this trend is expected to persist and worsen with bad years becoming more frequent or regular. In face of this emergency, LAdP is working expeditiously to improve efficiency of the system. At the same time, LAdP is actively exploring locating a site for an emergency backup community domestic water well and procuring the services of a design engineer. The LAdP membership is fully supportive of these measures.

First known as the Placitas Community Ditch, it was constructed and its water rights perfected on or about 1863. A 1942 declaration by the State Engineer of New Mexico recognized Las Acequias of the Community of Placitas' use of the water from the springs for irrigation and domestic purposes. Pipes were first installed in 1943 to supply domestic water from two of the springs to residents on the system. Through the years there have been periods of drought, which necessitated a moratorium on new members in the mid-1990s.
