Our History:

About the Archives

Created by the Legislature in 1956 as the official repository for the state's historical records, the Archives has called many places home since its conception.

The first site of our Archives was located in Peabody Hall at Louisiana State University, a dilapidated structure that was eventually slated for demolition by the State Fire Marshal's office.

That was home for the state's official records until 1966, when the State Archives relocated to a former warehouse on Choctaw Boulevard in the industrial section of Baton Rouge.

The warehouse, however, was not suitable for the proper preservation of the state's documentary heritage.

So in the early 1980s, following an extensive lobbying campaign, the Legislature funded construction of a new State Archives building not too far away, on Essen Lane.

In August 1987, this state of the art facility was officially opened. Designed by architect **John Desmond**, the building was hailed as one of the foremost archival facilities in the nation.

The five-panel facade on the Archives building is worth checking out.

The five panels, sculpted by noted Baton Rouge artist **Al Lavergne**, offer a panoramic "study in stone" of Louisiana's unique history both as a colony and as a state.
