6. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

A. Measure B: Trash & Recycling Cost-of-Service Study Update

Measure B was passed by voters in 2022 amending the People's Ordinance allowing fees for

trash collection from single family homes. The City of San Diego's Environmental Services Department will give an update on the Trash & Recycling Cost-of-Service Study which is currently underway. The City Council is considering implementing a new fee and enhanced services for City trash collection, which the study is exploring.

Environmental Services Department in attendance - Nathan and Rosalina discussed Measure B background, council timeline, resident preferences per survey including bulky item pickup, free bins after damage, weekly recycling, responded to board and public concerns including high rates, properties with multiple ADUs, residents using others' bins, resources on recycling/composting, and customer portal.

The San Diego Residential Lead Abatement Program remediates lead hazards in private residential structures throughout the City of San Diego, focusing on homeowners with properties that meet the following criteria:

- Housing built prior to 1960 (excluding properties scheduled for demolition, major remodel or properties with open code violations or unpermitted alterations; in violation of current health and safety codes that require more than minor repair; and institutional group quarters such as nursing homes, dormitories, rehabilitation residences, supervised apartment living quarters for youths and non-home based daycare centers).
- Or housing built prior to 1979 with a child less than 6 years of age who lives in, or otherwise frequently visits, who has detectable levels of lead in their blood based on a venous blood draw.
- Or any housing built prior to 1979 with a resident child less than 18 years of age with levels of lead in their blood at or above 5 micrograms per deciliter based on a venous blood draw.

Leticia Ayalla from Environmental Health Coalition discussed the Lead Abatement Program, reviewing the information above. She also distributed a signup sheet for the board members and public members interested in the program.
