INTRODUCTION

- 3. Read Ecclesiastes 7:3. In the message, Matt said, "Sadness has a refining influence in our lives." Do you agree? If so, what experiences of sadness have refined you?
- 4. If you're a Christian, does the future hope of heaven affect your present reality or do you tend to get mired in the mundane details of daily life?
- 5. In which area—financial or relational—do you need to begin to invest in eternity? Explain.
- 6. What is one step can you take to invest more in eternity? How can this group support you?
