

APHA Chrome Cash Rules

APHA Chrome Cash Entry Fee: (In addition to the class entry fee)

Youth Classes \$10.00

Open and Amateur Classes \$15.00

The **Chrome Cash** Entry Fee allows you to be eligible to WIN the Chrome Cash on DESIGNATED Chrome Cash Classes. You are not required to enter the concurrent Chrome Cash portion of any classes, but **MUST** enter if you are wanting a chance at the “money.”

There are 25 **Chrome Cash** Classes that will be held concurrently with their regular APHA Class. To be eligible for the Chrome Cash, an additional entry fee must be paid. We suggest you enter at the office, however, in-gate entries for Chrome Cash are accepted. Each exhibitor entering a Chrome Cash class must sign a W9 form in the office, prior to receiving any payout. If the exhibitor does not win any cash, the W9 will be handed back to the exhibitor at check out time.

Each Class has a designated amount of Chrome Cash available. The payout percentage amounts are the same, no matter which Chrome Cash class you enter.

50% – for the overall class average winner.

30% - for the overall second place class average winner.

20% - for the overall third place class average winner.

For example, in a \$500 Chrome Cash Class:

Winner gets 50% = \$250

Second Place gets 30% = \$150

Third Place gets 20% = \$100

The Youth classes have the same percentage of payout, although the Youth classes have only \$100-\$150 Chrome Cash.

There are no minimum entries needed in a class to award the Chrome Cash. If one entry in a \$500 class, the winner will still receive 50% of the CC, (\$250). If 2 entries, the winner will still receive 50% and the second place 30%. So, \$250 / \$150, respectively.

Ties: Since the class average winners COULD result in a tie – Monies will be added together and split between the exhibitors that were tied. There will not be a “call judge” or “tie-breaker judge” each day. For example, two exhibitors tied for 1st place. \$250 and \$150 added together, making each exhibitor to receive \$200 each.

Payouts: The payouts for the classes will be in the form of a check, made out to the exhibitor of the class. These will be available at the show office, and handed out upon a complete audit of the Chrome Cash class. A W9 must be completed prior to picking up the check.
