





The book of Psalms is a collection of 150 songs and poems. There are Psalms of praise, worship, history and prayer. They were probably written between 1400 and 500 B.C.






Paul dearly loved Onesimus. What did he say to Philemon about him?



Letter to Philemon


Philemon received a letter asking him to forgive someone.




Onesimus had changed since he heard Paul's teaching about Jesus.
