The Alumni Board recently hosted our K.C. Holiday Luncheon, which also serves as the Annual Meeting of the AKL Building Association. In addition to enjoying some amazing Jack Stack BBQ as well as the company of Delta alums spanning many generations, we listened to reports from representatives of the Alumni Board, the Ochino Foundation as well as both our outgoing and incoming chapter presidents.

I am proud to say that, through the tremendous work of many caring and committed individuals, the chapter is in excellent shape on every level—physically, interpersonally, academically, professionally, financially, and, of course, socially. All founded upon a shared mission to create the very BEST fraternity living experience at KU! In addition to unveiling a wall plaque recognizing the generous donations received from 45 caring alums, the Alumni Board highlighted three "living" legacy builders for their special contributions.

For his creative vision, financial commitment and development outreach, the Alumni Board voted to name the Sport Court after Tim Barton '85. In addition, the Alumni Board recognized the dedication of Joseph "Buzz" Prelogar '65 for his outstanding financial and project management by naming the new Executive Conference Room in his honor.

Finally, the Alumni Board recognized John Yorke '62 for his many years of faithful service to the fraternity—including serving as board president, chapter advisor and scholarship team advisor—by naming the 2nd Floor Conference Room after him.

- Visit mentoring.ku.edu and create a free profile using an email address. Current KU students can use their single sign-on to create a profile. Alumni should use a work or personal email account and are usually approved within 24 hours.
- During the sign-up process new users will be asked to answer questions about educational and work history. New users will also be asked to choose from a list of help topics they are willing to discuss with other Jayhawks. Please create a detailed profile (including professional photo), because detailed information helps students and other alumni best identify the Jayhawks with the right expertise and experiences to help them with specific questions and/or needs they have.
- Once approved, explore the platform. Visit:
 - O Career < Jobs to see the job board (please note the majority of positions on this job board are for experienced job seekers. Students looking for work or internships should visit hirejayhawks.com).
 - O Career < Career Paths for detailed information on the skills, common levels of education, personalities, and work responsibilities associated with specific industry areas. The platform will also suggest individuals you might want to network with and open job positions within the industry you are exploring.
 - O Connect < Community to search and filter for the nearly 10,000 KU alumni (and growing) on the platform. You can use location, industry, help topic, and dozens of other filters to search for the right fit for your networking and mentoring needs.

Alumni Spotlight



Joe Hatzfeld AKL '18

Joe Hatzfeld represents an excellent example of how the AKL fraternity experience lives up to our mission of creating men of character, committed to making a difference.

Despite being a double-legacy of Sigma Nu, Joe came to KU in 2018 as a freshman from Olathe, KS with no interest in joining a fraternity. His aspiration was to become a Civil Engineer, and he felt the potential distractions of "fraternity life" would inhibit his ability to receive the quality of education he desired. Upon meeting a few members of AKL, and seeing how serious they were about scholarship, he changed his mind and decided to pledge AKL.

At the time of Joe's arrival, the chapter was unhoused and met each Monday night for Chapter Meetings in a conference room located within the Kansas Union. Joe was impressed by both the professionalism of the executive board in running the meeting as well as the commitment and dedication of its diverse membership to fulfill the Creed of AKL while living out our Five Ideals – building a solid foundation upon which to form life-long bonds of brotherhood.

While considering himself an introvert, Joe stepped out of his "comfort zone" to serve as an officer within the house. Joe started as the Recruitment Chairman, and the following year was elected Chapter President as Delta Chapter transitioned from being unhoused to housed as part of the 4-year lease of the DU house.

It was during this transition, which included the Covid-19 pandemic, where Joe felt his greatest growth – both personally and professionally – took place. When asked which of the Five Ideals resonated most with Joe he said, "When I first joined AKL, my focus was on Scholarship; however, because of my growth experiences within the house, I left realizing the importance of Leadership."

Today, Joe serves as a Civil Analyst at Kimley-Horn, a Civil Engineering firm located in Kansas City. While building client relationships, Joe credits his role as Recruitment Chairman for helping develop skills in sales and relationship building as well as his role as Chapter President for honing his communication (both oral and written) and leadership skills.

Without citing any specific events, activities or special moments, Joe's fondest memories of AKL were times he spent with various brothers in the house just doing "life" together.



President's Report Braden Hoffman Delta '22

The AKL Chapter House at 1505 Sigma Nu Place welcomed sixty-two men into its doors at the beginning of the 2024 fall semester. This includes thirty-four new members due to the efforts of our elected Recruitment Chairs, Blake Fries and Ben Anderson. This exceeded our goals and represented the largest recruitment class AKL has brought in since returning to campus. A successful move-in process was made possible thanks to our House Director, Sara Russell, and new House Manager, Evan Bannister.

The Delta Chapter of Alpha Kappa Lambda has built a tradition of leadership and excellence through the consistent application of our Five Ideals: Judeo-Christian Principles, Scholarship, Leadership, Loyalty, and Self-Support. Our Five Ideals were expressed throughout the past year through philanthropy, community service, brotherhood, leadership, recruitment, and social events.

Some key highlights included the unveiling of the new Brotherhood Activity Room (BAR) on the lower level of the chapter house during the KU vs. K-State Football Alumni Watch Party. The active chapter, along with alumni and parents, came together to cheer on the Jayhawks and see all the new basement amenities. The event was a remarkable success, with great attendance thanks to Roger Williams and our Loyalty Chair, Jackson Kuhl.

Additionally, AKL's own platform for the KU mentoring program is being created to connect alumni with active members.

Led by Philanthropy Chair, Lucas Reiter in partnership with Community Service Chair, Nate Hesse and their respective teams, AKL won the "Chapters for Charity" event in April last semester – beating out all Greek houses on campus. The contest included multiple competitions, culminating in an overall winner and a prize of \$1,000. Additionally, we won the award for National Ritual Celebration Week among all Greek houses. As part of our multi-pronged "These Hands Don't Hurt" campaign during both Sexual Assault Prevention Month in April and Domestic Violence Awareness Month in October, we raised a significant amount of awareness and financial contributions for The Willow – a women's shelter in Lawrence. Finally, we raised the most money among all participants for the Lenexa Fire Department's "Hero Pull." For our efforts, we were honored to receive the KC Metro Organization of the Year award from the Special Olympics of Kansas. This fall semester, we raised nearly \$5,000 through these various philanthropic and community service events and competitions.

I am proud to report that AKL was well-represented at the recent Sorority & Fraternity Life Awards Ceremony this spring. We received a Mark of Excellence (the highest honor!) in two categories and a Mark of Distinction in the others.

We had a great turn out and raised a total of \$600 over the course of the day. In addition, we participated in both a Chipotle and Jefferson's percentage night where as a house we take in 25% of what we spend there on that night—this added another \$237 to our total donation to The Willow—a women's shelter in Lawrence, Kansas.

Earlier this fall, Delta Gamma hosted a philanthropy event "Anchor Games" where our men took first place against all other fraternities. Later this semester, we participated in the "Hero's Pull" challenge event hosted by the Fire Department of Lenexa, Kansas to raise money for the Special Olympics of Kansas.
