As previously announced, the AKL Building Association has entered into a long-term lease on a new 60-man chapter house located at 1505 Sigma Nu Pl. This includes a 25-year term based upon a series of 5-year renewal options at a negotiated rate below standard cost of living adjustments. Given there are no more lots zoned for Greek housing in Lawrence, this presents a very unique opportunity for Delta chapter to remain a housed fraternity for years to come! We are also very glad to announce that our current house mom Sara Russell will be joining us in the new house!

While the property is only five years old and in excellent condition from a structural integrity perspective, there are several areas that need improvement to achieve our goal of providing men with the very "best fraternity living experience" at KU:

- Exterior Upgrades (Curb Appeal)
- Entry / Living Room Upgrades ("WOW!" Factor)
- Expanded House Director Suite
- Expanded Dining Room
- New Back Patio & Deck
- New Lower Level Game Room

Please watch the Zoom recording of our Founder's Day Celebration to review the proposed floor plan and design treatments. To accomplish our goal, we are taking a phased approach that will prioritize the projects that must be completed before our men move into the house in August, followed by other projects based upon the success of our fundraising efforts. To that end, we are officially kicking off a Fundraising Plan that will allow us to raise enough money to complete all phases of this important project. This is being led by Tim Barton '85. The "good news" is we have already established a significant foundation of seed money pledged by several brothers; however, we need YOUR help to bring this vision to reality. Personal & Professional Development – Excellence



Congrats Peter on the spotlight we are very proud of you!


## Philanthropy
