We started off last fall by moving into our new chapter house—christening the house as well as celebrating the completion of Phase I of our New Chapter House Improvement Plan during our AKL Alumni Homecoming event in late October. The house looks amazing, and is literally the "talk" on campus, but we're not done yet!

Today, I am happy to report that we have received enough fundraising commitments to begin Phase II of this project, which will focus on building out the Brotherhood Activity Room (BAR) on the Lower Level. This will create a unique indoor facility that features a Sport Court (Pickle Ball, Futsal/Soccer, Floor Hockey) as well as a Pool Table, Ping Pong Table, Foosball and a new Exercise Room to go along with big screen TV's and a new sound system and lighting package.

Work is expected to commence soon with the project being completed this summer in time for our men to return for the fall semester. The completion of Phases I and II will help us achieve our goal of providing the very **BEST** "fraternity living experience" at KU!

But we all know that the fraternity experience represents much more than just a brick 'n mortar facility to live in—rather it provides an opportunity to build relationships along with both personal and professional skills that can last a lifetime.

To that point, I am excited to announce the creation of the new **AKL Mentoring Program!** Built upon the foundation of the KU Mentoring+ platform as part of the Jayhawk Career Network, AKL will be the very first Greek house on campus to have our own affinity group to allow us to interact with each other directly. 



- During the sign-up process new users will be asked to answer questions about educational and work history. New users will also be asked to choose from a list of help topics they are willing to discuss with other Jayhawks. Please create a detailed profile (including professional photo), because detailed information helps students and other alumni best identify the Jayhawks with the right expertise and experiences to help them with specific questions and needs that they have.

Mr. Taylor has thirty-five years of experience in public accounting, principally in the financial services industry, serving many major such organizations in Kansas City, St. Louis, and Minneapolis. Mr. Taylor was a co-owner and director of a community bank for fifteen years, actively involved in the acquisition, borrowing, lending, and sale activities of the bank and its holding company.

Since retirement from Ernst & Young LLP, he has joined the Boards of RBC Funds, a private insurance company, and a private technology company; served on the leadership team for Citizens for Higher Education, a group of executives advocating for Kansas state funding of higher education.

In recent years, Mr. Taylor has been a member of the Boards of Directors and Treasurer or Finance Chair of the Kansas City Symphony, The Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art, <u>UMKC Foundation</u>, Church of the Resurrection Foundation, and Breckenridge Creative Arts.



A message from our Chairman: Lucas Reiter








The Ballard Center provides wrap-around supports to families through their food pantry, clothing closets, emergency assistance programs, and other initiatives.

We made a banner and hung it in the front of the house for April that emphasized These Hands Don't Hurt, and Sexual Assault Prevention Month.
