Two places map programs may get it wrong for our location

- 1. Hit "DETOUR BY ROAD" if available in any program that tries to send you down BOY SCOUT CAMP ROAD (impassable sugar sand, usually only for 4-wheel drive & off-road vehicles only. (You'll see an open fence entrance & mailboxes at Saddle Creek Rd. within 25 feet of a yellow NO OUTLET sign. Turn around and go south on State Road 415 if you still see Boy Scout Camp Road in your driving directions. Enter our part of Osteen further south, near Volusia County biking/hiking overpass on SR415)
- 2. About a block after entering Saddle Creek dirt-road, turn left at V/curve to stay on Saddle Creek Farms Road. Most programs have correct map picture but some say to turn wrong way

FROM I-4, south Deltona, DeBary, Orange City, South DeLand, West Seminole County (Heathrow, Sanford)

- Exit 108, DeBary/Deltona city limit sign/Enterprise exit
- East/left 8 miles on CR4162 Dirksen/Deltona/Doyle roads as you drive toward Osteen
- Right/south at SR415 traffic light

Heading south on SR415 in Osteen:

- Pass Skip's Boots, Fox Head bar/lounge on right
- Third left onto New Smyrna Road immediately after leaving Doyle Road/CR4162 (just before Volusia County biking/hiking overpass & fire station)
- Immediate left on Florida Ave., quickly becomes Osteen-Maytown Road
- 5.6 miles east on Osteen-Maytown Road before you turn again

 Speed trap – 30 mph speed limit traveling eastward until you pass the golf course

To Pell Road (5.6 miles to get there):

- After two small bridges
- Pass Vat & Elizabeth roads on right, pass Rebel Run on left, shortly before you reach Pell
- Yellow traffic sign says Pell as you approach comes up fast
- Small yellow Lucas Palms sign just before turning north on Pell
- Towards Wiregrass Prairie Reserve

North on Pell RD for 4 miles (only one way to turn onto Pell RD - other side at intersection is biking/hiking path

- Pass by Prideaux & pass Oakridge Farms roads on right. Turn right onto Saddle Creek Farms RD
- Paw prints painted on occasional power poles

IF PAVEMENT ON PELL ROAD RUNS OUT BEFORE YOU TURN ON SADDLE CREEK YOU HAVE GONE TOO FAR – TURN AROUND NOW! SUGAR SAND AHEAD AFTER PELL BECOMES A DIRT ROAD Right/east on Saddle Creek Farms RD

<u>4 miles on Pell to Saddle Creek Farms Road</u> (last street on right before Pell pavement ends)

<u>If pavement on Pell Road runs out before you turn on Saddle Creek you have gone too far – turn around now!</u> Paw prints pointing right on last power pole on right before turn into Saddle Creek.



- Saddle Creek Farms RD. street sign
- 1 mile of safe-when-slow dirt roads to Best Paw Forward Inc.
- No Outlet yellow sign just before turn onto Saddle Creek Farms Road
- Turn right before passing sign that says Pavement Ends
- Saddle Creek sign on white fencing
- Double bank of mailboxes on right by fence -- turn in between open gates
- You are invited guests ignore No Trespassing sign
- 10 MILES PER HOUR ON DIRT ROAD speeding messes up cars & road, can get you expelled from class with no refund



Short block to next turn: Left at V intersection to remain on Saddle Creek Farms RD (10 mph speed limit sign on power pole where you turn left)

- Some GPS programs have right map picture, wrong words for this turn
- Few street signs in subdivision -- landmarks help
- Avoid drainage ditches (& drainage pipe areas, except when you turn in driveway (a) the pipe runs under our driveway of course)



- Pass 2-story house on right
- Right on Oak View Plantation RD
- runs between horse & cattle pastures



Immediate next (first) left at Oak Haven Plantation RD

- Second home on right
- Small Best Paw Forward sign next to driveway
- Dog signs on fence (DOG STREET green sign on gate)
- Green-roofed storage building in back with large red paw prints
- Driveway near center of front fence
- Covered area next to driveway for most classes
- Agility & obedience rings with jumps, other equipment in front fields on either side of driveway
- Precision work, private sessions, workshops usually in white training barn
