

Looking back at 2024, it's amazing to think about the start of this project. At our first meeting in 2022, we didn't know if we'd collect enough books for more than a single school

visit.

But last year alone, we visited 48 classrooms and over 800 students. Since we started, we've donated over 8,500 books to underserved nursery, preschool, and kindergarten students throughout the Colorado Springs area (4,000+ just in 2024!).

We hope those books are a spark that lights a love of reading throughout the lives of those children.

The spark that keeps **US** going is the incredible help of our volunteers and donors! It's inspiring (and a bit of a relief!) to know that when we need help, our volunteers are just an email away.

We head into 2025 with aspirations to increase the frequency of our book distributions, explore more grant opportunities, and to spread the joy of reading even farther. I know we'll do it -- and I know it wouldn't be possible without all your support and help.


## 2024 Impact Summary






#### **Books Distributed by Year**

## 2024 Volunteer Report



#### 4 volunteer events

Group volunteer events are held about once a quarter and focus on cataloging and cleaning book donations, as well as preparing the book bags for distribution



#### 12 school visits

Including nursery (birth to 3 years old), preschool, and kindergarten classrooms across multiple school districts in the Colorado Springs area



#### 95+ volunteer hours

Volunteers ranged in age from 5-91 and their time represents \$3,454 in donated labor (per independent sector.org)

## History and Mission

More Books in Children's Hands was founded in March 2022 to honor the life and legacy of Debbie Leivers -- a long-time elementary teacher in Academy School District 20. There was little that Debbie enjoyed more in life than children and a good book.



After her passing in late 2021, we wanted a way to continue to share the things that were important to her and founded More Books in Children's Hands.

Our mission is simple: to help spread the joy of reading by making sure that underserved preschool and kindergarten students in the Colorado Springs region have access to ageappropriate reading material.

To accomplish this, we visit Title 1 kindergarten classrooms and Head Start preschool classrooms, read to the students, and give them each a bag of five books.

Our approach is modeled after Children Read Atlanta, a non-profit based in Atlanta I always smile when I see the delight and happiness the gift of books brings to so many children. I know it would fill Debbie with joy.


