




The first lens we help you to look through is what is the outside of your church.

By conducting a thorough review of your website, marketing, and social media platforms, we can enhance their effectiveness and ensure they truly represent your brand.




The Orange Circle: Outer Level of Church Ministry

This level represents the operations and presentations that interact with the outside world, giving newcomers their first impressions of the church.

The **Four P's**: There are four aspects to consider that affect newcomers' impressions:

- Place: Refers to physical amenities, location, cleanliness, parking, facilities, etc.
- Personalities: Key individuals like the lead pastor, greeters, worship leader, ushers, and volunteers who interact with newcomers.
- People: The church's regular attendees shape its spirit and environment, impacting newcomers' perceptions.
- Programs: Includes worship services, children's ministry, youth programs, and other offerings for newcomers and their families.
- First Impressions Matter: Like a restaurant visit, people form lasting opinions about a church during their initial experience.
- People's Attitudes: The attitudes and friendliness of church members significantly influence newcomers' feelings about the church.






The Orange Circle Continued

- Connecting with Others: Newcomers seek a sense of belonging and often look for familiar faces or potential friends within the church.
- Importance of Programs: Quality programs, especially for children, can encourage newcomers to give the church another chance.
- Realistic Expectations: Newcomers don't expect perfection but want to feel that the church is a good fit for them.
- Removing Barriers: The church's primary goal should be to identify and address barriers in place, personalities, people, and programs that may deter newcomers from visiting or committing.

In summary, a church's ability to attract and retain new members hinges on the initial impressions formed regarding the place, personalities, people, and programs offered during a newcomer's first visit.

Addressing potential barriers in these areas is crucial for church growth and spiritual health.






The Blue Circle: Second Level of Ministry

The second level serves two primary purposes:

- Establishing an invisible infrastructure that supports the church's facilities, staff, people, and programs.
- Creating a pathway from the first circle (Orange) to the third circle (spiritual growth and meaningful involvement) by enabling newcomers to grow in their faith and involvement.

This level involves the operational systems of management, accounting, staffing, and problemsolving that are vital for the church's daily functioning.

Like a hidden steel framework in a skyscraper ensures its durability, the hidden structural operations of a church determine its sustainability and effectiveness.



The second level of church ministry serves as a bridge between the initial impressions that newcomers have of the church and the long-term goals of spiritual growth and meaningful engagement in the church family.


It ensures that the church can fulfill its ministry mandate effectively.



The Green Circle: Discipleship


As it is in the "Great Commission", the highest priority for churches should be guiding and assisting the church family grow in their knowledge of the Bible, faith, and personal devotion to Christ is of utmost importance for any church.

This growth will not occur by accident, but by deliberate and focused effort.



The specific methods may vary, but the church's commitment to these core aspects should be evident in three ways:


- Discipleship: Focusing on individual believers' growth in understanding, believing, and applying God's Word through faith.
- Community: Encouraging believers to be actively involved in the church body, typically seen through attendance and giving.
- Service: Transitioning believers from being part of a problem to being part of God's solution by actively serving others in Jesus' name, both within the church and in everyday life.



The Red Circle: Evangelism


Jesus left the church with two primary directives - evangelizing the lost and discipling believers.

Ironically, these are the areas where most churches struggle. Few churches in the United States (less than 10%) are effectively winning the lost.



Excellence in the initial three "circles" of church health leads to excellence in evangelism, which is the ultimate responsibility of every church and believer and measures a church's impact on society.

Few churches are actively engaged in evangelism, and statistics show that only a small percentage are following the New Testament model of actively sharing the Gospel and impacting their communities..
