

The vision of Nashville Singers is to be a dynamic choral leader, enriching lives through the performance of significant music; collaborating with highly engaged and skilled donors to make a substantial impact on music education in our schools and the community.







The Nashville Singers organization was founded in November of 2008 by a handful of men committed to excellence in vocal and choral performance. The chorus performs a diverse, primarily a cappella repertoire, covering many genres of music.

Since its formation, this volunteer vocal ensemble has grown from four to 11 singers, learned over 90 songs, released two audio CDs, racked up 120 performances for 70 clients in 11 counties across Tennessee, and produced a successful concert series which has attracted 3,500+ attendees from 43 cities in 10 states across the USA. Performances by the Nashville Singers have been enjoyed by over 50,000 people to date.

The Nashville Business Journal's annual "Book of Lists" has ranked the Nashville Singers in the "Top 10" in their annual list of the top performing arts organizations in Middle Tennessee for four consecutive years.

Their mission is to enrich lives through singing and the support of music education. In the last six years, this volunteer ensemble has awarded \$19,000 in music education grants and scholarships, impacting hundreds of students at numerous schools and music-focused nonprofits across Middle Tennessee. The chorus also hosts master classes for middle and high school students, and a vocal performance clinic called Acappella Academy. Some of the world-class clinicians collaborating with the Nashville Singers to lead these programs include Dr. Kirby Shaw, Dr. Cedric Dent, and Derric Johnson.

The Nashville Singers have had the pleasure of sharing the stage with many talented performing artists that include Bath Male Choir, Ringmasters, Vintage Mix, Steve Williams, Erica Lane, Grace Thomson, Melody Myers, Kasey Hammond, Jennifer Danielle Green, Noelle LaRue, Music City Chorus, Lunch Break Quartet, The Suntones, Fisk Jubilee Singers, Nashville in Harmony, TuneTown Show Chorus, Metro Nashville Chorus, MLK Reunion Choir, The O'Donnells, MET Singers, Music City Youth Orchestra, Sound Company Children's Choir, and the Midnight Ramblers.

The Nashville Singers have also enjoyed singing for several dignitaries, including Nashville Mayor Karl Dean, United States Senator Trent Lott, Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam, and Lieutenant Governor Ron Ramsey.

ARTISTIC DIRECTOR - Todd Wilson has guided Nashville Singers from the beginning with his vision for attaining the highest standards of choral excellence on and off the stage. His enthusiasm for the impact of choral music on the lives of both singers and listeners is evident at any rehearsal or public performance, as well as through the music itself. Todd's experience as a singer started at age six. He has provided musical leadership to six different mixed, male or female choral ensembles in Florida, Texas, Illinois, and Tennessee. Todd has earned six International Chorus Championships with the internationally-acclaimed

Vocal Majority Chorus, and an International Quartet Championship with ACOUSTIX. That foursome has produced six CD projects since 1991 and has appeared on another 35 audio and video releases to date. Wilson got his college education from the University of North Texas, Strayer University, and Palm Beach Community College. Todd has worked for Amazon since 2016 in a variety of roles. He currently works as a Compliance Analyst and is based at BNA12, Amazon's corporate office in Nashville. In 2000, he was inducted into the "Hall of Fame" of the Southwestern District of the Barbershop Harmony Society. Wilson is a 51-year member of that organization and is also a member of the National Society of Collegiate Scholars, and the Association of International Champions. Todd and his oldest son Taylor are two of the four founders of the ensemble. When he's not musically engaged with the Nashville Singers, Todd and his youngest son Travis play in the trumpet section of the Nashville Community Concert Band. He and his wife Jennifer have been married since 1989. Todd received the Nashville Singers Member of the Year Award for 2009.



DIRECTOR OF MUSIC - Sloan lives in the Nashville area and is involved in the arts as a conductor, chorus member, studio singer, professional actor, teacher, and guitarist. He is passionate about the arts and currently serves as the Musical Director at Act Too Players. In this role, Sloan provides musical direction and vocal instruction for the high school students working on musicals during each semester. Additionally, he has several private voice students. From 2002-2009, Sloan was very active in the Nashville theater community and appeared on stage in over 25 shows mostly at the Boiler Room Theater in

Franklin. Since September 2009, he's enjoyed singing with Nashville Singers and currently serves as the Director of Music. From 2012-2015, Sloan served as the Associate Director of The Nashville Choir conducting rehearsals and performances at Nashville churches and the Schermerhorn Symphony Center. From August 2018 - July 2019, he served as the Interim Chancel Choir Director at Covenant Presbyterian Church. He has also enjoyed singing with Nashville Chamber Singers. Sloan enjoys golf, watching college football (War Eagle!), practicing piano, reading, exercising and hanging out with his two nephews Dylan and Derek. He resides in Brentwood, Tennessee. Sloan was the President and Board Chair of Nashville Singers in 2012. He currently serves as the Director of Music, Bass Section Leader, Board Member At Large and on the Music Evaluation Committee. Sloan received the Nashville Singers Member of the Year Award in 2012 and 2015.
