We look forward to 2025 and the changes it brings to the Aged Care Sector. The Support at Home Program will commence from 1st July 2025 and will replace the existing Home Care Packages program and Short-Term Restorative Care program. Our Commonwealth Home Support Program (CHSP) will continue until 1st July 2027.

From 1st July 2025, as a CHSP provider Meals on Wheels will be covered by the New Aged Care Act. The Act outlines the obligations and responsibilities aged care providers must follow, setting rules for funding, regulation and approval of providers. This new law is deigned to improve the lives of older people accessing aged care services in their homes, community settings and residential aged care and encourage aged care providers to deliver high quality care.

At present, Meals on Wheels is very busy and is receiving new referrals daily. We not only have clients that must eat food prepared in a certain way, but there are also many different dietary requirements that the service provides for.

As part of our obligations, Meals on Wheels must ensure the correct meals are delivered to the correct clients. For example, one client may require food to be cut up, while another may require food to be pureed or they may have allergies.

The service is very conscious of ensuring all meals are labelled correctly, so it makes it easier for our volunteers to see at-a-glance who each meal is made for.
