



24-Hour Curfew Imposed Following Ethnopolitical Violence in Lamurde

Date & Time: Thursday 11 July 2025 (local time)
Location: Lamurde, Adamawa State, Nigeria
Threat Level: (Moderate to High)



On Thursday, 11 July 2025, the Governor of Adamawa State imposed a 24-hour curfew on Lamurde LGA following recent ethnopolitical clashes between the Lunguda and Waja ethnic groups. The violence originally flared on 2 July in Lafiya town and escalated into surrounding villages. The curfew is part of an effort to de-escalate tensions and prevent further clashes.

While a community dialogue forum has been initiated by tribal leaders to address the root causes of the violence, the situation remains fragile. Past peace efforts, including the 'Peace Accord' facilitated by an Intergovernmental Organisation, have not led to sustained reconciliation. There is a continued risk of retaliatory attacks, and ethnic affiliation may influence individual exposure to harm.

Immediate Advice

- Avoid all non-essential travel to Lamurde LGA and surrounding areas until further notice.
- Implement identity-sensitive staff risk assessments, particularly for national staff affiliated with either ethnic group involved.
- Review programmatic engagement in the LGA for conflict sensitivity and potential reputational risks.
- Maintain regular communication with field staff and activate check-in protocols.
- Engage local stakeholders and protection partners for updates on conflict dynamics.
- Ensure emergency relocation and contingency plans are updated and context-specific.

Future Recommendations

- Monitor local media and official announcements for updates on curfew duration and movement restrictions.
- Coordinate with local authorities and community leaders before resuming operations.
- Conduct a rapid context reassessment prior to re-entry into affected areas.
- Report any staff safety concerns through internal incident tracking channels.
