## 5. Business arising from previous meeting

- We need to have wheelchair door automation installed
- Benefits include energy efficiency
- Location would be by the second set of doors by the elevator
- We should also reverse the direction of the doors opening on to the ice surface (currently

the doors can be pushed open by the air pressure in the lobby)

- Electronic control in compressor room needs to be replaced (a cost of about \$60 000)
- We can switch the compressor from the current single unit of 50 HP to two 30 HP units (this will help create a power redundancy in the system)
- The evaporator also needs to be replaced (a cost of about \$100 000)
- Simco is to give us a quote on replacing the above equipment (we have not heard back from them yet)
- We would like to get the City of White Rock involved
- In order to not disrupt the following curling season, the job would need to start right after the completion of the 2024 -2025 season (April 2025)

- Christine and Dale will be meeting with the CWR on Sept. 17 at 3 p.m. to discuss the lease and operating agreement
- Christine will be attending a "Women in Curling" seminar in Port Moody on September 21

## 7. Managers Report

- Celebration of Life ceremony from the previous week went very well

  - Attendees thought the drinks were inexpensive
- There will be a wedding reception on Saturday
- Nine schools have booked to use our ice at a cost of \$5 per child
- Do not know if the gaming grant has been approved yet
- We have filled 361 out of 705 possible curling spots (this does not include Learn to Curl)
- Aspira needs to pay for in-ice advertisement and signage
- Asahi has offered a \$1500 sponsorship for the High Tides bonspiel
  - Ross is working on a 5 year deal with Asahi
- no Sunday Novice league so far
- PACC is to move their banking from Scotiabank to Coast Capital'
- If we are to run a junior program, we will need to purchase two sets of Little Rocks at a cost of \$4500 each
- Ross needs a new printer
- We have bought wings from Pratts for \$3 per dozen for the air fryer in the Upper Lounge
- Ross found 3 crock pots in storage
  - Patti can premake chili to sell upstairs
  - We need items that can cook quickly for upstairs
- we should have sports showing on the TVs upstairs
- Curl BC is resurrecting the Day of Champions across the Lower Mainland
  - Langley will host the event in April 2025
  - Curl BC will also be creating bonspiels that cater to different levels of skill
  - Training information will be coming out soon
  - Curl BC is encouraging adaptive curling
- There has been a problem with flooding in the kitchen (the culprit is the grease trap)
- Patti will not be renewing her contract with PACC as she will be retiring at the end of this

curling season
