# Held at Peace Arch Curling Club on March 10, 2025

#### · Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:33 pm

- Agenda: Moved/Seconded (Mark T/ Keith) Motion Carried that the agenda for this meeting be approved as published
- Approval of Minutes of February 10, 2025 Board Meeting: Moved/Seconded (Keith/ Mark T) Motion Carried that the minutes be approved as published.
- · Business arising from previous meeting
  - a) Candlelight Cuisine replacement
    - Financing is proceeding. New owner has enough cash to cover first six months. Lender requires a copy of the lease to finalize financing. Draft lease being prepared. PACC will propose two-year lease initially.
    - Agreed the draft contract should include right of refusal for bonspiel catering from either side: either the caterer can decline or PACC can decline
    - Agreed the draft contract should specify how lease extensions at the end of the term may be arranged
    - PACC will need to inventory the existing kitchen equipment to understand what equipment PACC is responsible for, and include that in the draft lease

- Daytime ladies league will be considering whether to pursue this. Mary Holmes will lead.
- May need to deconflict this with the other events in the draft 2025/2026 calendar

## • President's Report

- Nothing else to report other than what was discussed above
- Manager's Report

- Reference March 2025 managers report draft.docx
- Priority registration scheme for 2025/2026 season
  - Agreed that returning teams who played in a league in 2024/2025 will have first right of refusal on those same leagues until Sept 1, 2025. After Sept 1 registration will be opened to anyone. Will coordinate priority registration with the skips.
- Draft 2025/2026 calendar
  - Agreed that the club will be closed on Family Day for maintenance
  - Agreed that the club will be closed on Sunday and Monday over the Thanksgiving Day weekend
  - Agreed to add social Saturday nights into the schedule as proposed
  - Moved/Seconded (Keith/Mary) Motion Carried that the draft calendar be adopted as proposed
- Proposed league pricing for next year
  - Goal is that all leagues pay approximately the same price per game
  - Decision on league fees is required by July
  - Agreed to table this for further discussion at the next board meeting
- Sleeman's Cup Club championship in Langley
  - Agreed that the selection of teams that will represent PACC will be
    - Men's: Men's A winner from Day of Champions
    - Open: Open winner from Day of Champions
    - Women's: Ladies Day Teams winner from Day of Champions
    - Novice: Saturday Novice winner from Day of Champions
    - If first choice team declines or does not meet the criteria, the runner up will be offered the opportunity
  - **Moved/Seconded (Keith/Greg) Motion Carried** that PACC will cover 50% of the entry cost (\$750) with the representing teams covering the other 50%
- PACC participation in Business of Curling Symposium
  - Agreed to table further discussion until next meeting when Mark Evans is present
- Given the success of the Monday Appy league, should consider a similar format on Fridays. Or consider shifting the entire Friday league to start earlier (5pm)
- Would like to pursue the idea of veteran skips participating in the novice league with new curlers. The goal would be to make it into a development league
- Board should consider imposing a volunteer fee for next year to encourage involvement in the club. Fee is returned to those who provide at least minimum volunteer hours to the club.
- Propose 3% surcharge if fees paid by credit card
