Did You Know?

A common question I am asked is - When is the end over?

Historically an end was over when the rock stopped but this changed a few years ago. When the bell rings you finish the end you are in and play one more. According to Curling Canada rules (section 2 (7)) an end is officially over when the score is decided. This includes the need to measure a stone to determine a point. If the bell rings during this time and score has been decided then the end is over and two more ends can be played. If score wasn't decided then only one more end.

Where do I stand as a skip?

When you don't have the house it is best practice to be on the back board or behind the back line. You should not move nor have your broom in a position that may cause a distraction. Only two players should be watching-usually third and skip.

What happens if two rocks are so close to pin?

If you are unable to measure or decide who is shot because the rocks are so close to the pin, ask another person from another sheet to look. If they cannot decide then the end is considered a blank.
