Curl Canada has increased their fee to \$5 after 20 years of no increases. Next year the total cost will be \$27. Curl BC \$21, Insurance \$1, and Curl Can \$5. This fee will be increasing over the next few years to a total of \$30. Funds to go towards curling development.
