

## 7:00pm - Paradox Café versus LaCorte Family Auto - 60ft field

Paradox Café played LaCorte Family Auto as the schedule wrapped around for their second meeting of the year. Don Carlin started the game for Paradox driving a single for the first RBI. LaCorte was quick to post 3 runs of their own in the first inning as the blazing, setting sun affected both teams on the right side of the field.
