

The Season



The first Sunday after Epiphany Day (January 6) is known as Baptism of the Lord referring to Matthew 3: 13-17, Mark 1:9-11, Luke 3:21-22 and John 1:29-34. The appropriate symbols are water, the baptismal shell or font, a descending dove, and a cross standing in water. The emphasis for the remainder of the season is on the beginning of Jesus' ministry, the miracles performed, and Jesus' works and teachings. The last Sunday of this periods is known as the Transfiguration of the Lord referring to the revelation of Jesus' true nature to the disciples (Peter, James and John) on the Mount of Olives. Prominent symbols for the Transfiguration include a crown surrounded by rays or paintings of Jesus with a glorious radiating effect or glistening garments. White is the appropriate color for this Sunday. The beginning date of the season is January 6 and the appropriate liturgical color is green. Note that white is used on Epiphany Day and the first Sunday after Epiphany day.

Crown The crown is a headpiece worn to designate royalty, social, political or religious status. It represents Jesus as King, Ruler and Lord of all. The crown may also represent the final reward for believers who have been faithful to God.

Descending Dove Is a symbol of the Holy Spirit, denoting the descent upon Jesus at the time of His baptism by John the Baptist.

Sixth Sunday Morning in Epiphany

(Acts 8:26-35)

Now an angel of the Lord spoke to Philip saying, “Arise and go toward the south along the road which goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.” This is desert. So he arose and went.

And behold, a man of Ethiopia, a eunuch of great authority under Candace the queen of the Ethiopians, who had charge of all her treasury, and had come to Jerusalem to worship, was returning.

And sitting in his chariot, he was reading Isaiah the prophet. Then the Spirit said to Philip, “Go near and overtake this chariot.”

So Philip ran to him, and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah, and said. “Do you understand what you are reading?”

And he said, “How can I, unless someone guides me?” And he asked Philip to come up and sit with him.



Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is a [solemn](#) reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God and marks the beginning of the penitential Lenten season

Lent, in the Christian [church](#), a 40-day period of penitential preparation for [Easter](#). For many Christians, Lent is a season for [fasting](#) and [abstinence](#) in imitation of [Jesus Christ](#)'s fasting in the wilderness before he began his public ministry. Almsgiving, the practice of giving money or food to the poor and performing other acts of [charity](#), is also encouraged. In Western churches Lent begins on [Ash Wednesday](#), six and a half weeks before Easter, and excludes Sundays. In Eastern churches Lent begins on the Monday of the seventh week before Easter and ends on the Friday before [Holy Week](#) (Passion Week) that immediately precedes Easter. This 40-day "Great Lent" includes Saturdays and Sundays as relaxed fast days.

The Office of Youth Opportunities (OYO) is excited to share that applications for the 2026 Mayor's Youth Employment Program (MYEP) are now open for summer work experiences and job placement opportunities. We are asking for your help in sharing this opportunity with your networks.

For interested youth, the MYEP application is available online at <https://charlottenc.gov/youth>. To participate, youth must be at least 16 years old on or before April 15, 2026, live in the city or attend a CMS high school, and be eligible to work in the United States. The application deadline is February 18, 2026.

Office of Youth Opportunity staff are available to help youth complete the application. Applicants (or their parents, guardians or advocates) can request assistance by emailing myep@charlottenc.gov. Additionally, OYO staff will host onsite hands-on support at all Title I high schools in the coming weeks.

The Office of Youth Opportunities team is also actively recruiting employers and partners. Please share with your networks these ways that employers can get involved:

- Become a Host Employer, providing paid work-based learning experiences for youth. This experience introduces youth to the world of work, builds social capital, creates career clarity, and promotes upward economic mobility.
- Sponsor a nonprofit work experience for youth through work-based learning opportunities with local 501(c)(3) organizations. Your contribution can offset the costs to these nonprofit organizations, allowing them to provide work and mentorship to youth.
- Share your expertise as a subject matter expert for the Mayor's Youth Employment Program. Through interactions with professionals in various career fields, youth can learn firsthand the work you do and the journey to get there.
- Organize an Industry Day, an engaging site visit to your office where youth can experience an industry firsthand and interact professionals in the field. Industry Days build social capital through networking, provide career clarity, and inspire youth to continue seeking opportunities and career paths they may not have been aware of.
- Partner on community-based beautification projects like gardening or park clean ups that allow youth to give back to their neighborhoods while learning new skills. Through these projects, youth can develop a sense of pride in their community while gaining practical skills in environmental stewardship, teamwork and project management that can benefit their future careers.
