The Season



LENT is the period of time to reflect on the events that led Jesus to Calvary. For some, Lent is the time of fasting, sacrifice and preparation. The purple background symbolizes royalty, praying, fasting and penitence. The gold found in the fringe, denotes worth, virtue, glory to God and Christian might. Each symbol used points to Jesus' suffering.

THE PASSION CROSS—This is a Latin cross that has pointed ends on each arm and expresses pain. It represents the painful suffering that Jesus endured on the cross. It is sometimes called the cross of agony or suffering.

CROWN OF THORNS—Symbolized the mockery of Jesus by the soldiers after Jesus was arrested. It indicates the Kingship of Jesus Christ and Jesus' suffering at the hands of the Jews. It also notes the cruelty of humans toward each other.

HAMMER AND NAILS—These are symbols of the brutal crucifixion of Jesus on Mount Calvary as Jesus' hands and feet were nailed to the cross. They also serve as a reminder that Jesus possessed a human nature that experienced pain, as well as a divine nature.

THE RESPONSIVE READING

Third Sunday Morning in Lent

(Romans 6:15-23)

What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? Certainly not!

Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin to death, or of obedience to righteousness?

But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered. And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness.

I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented your members as slaves of uncleanness, and of lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present your members as slaves of righteousness for holiness.

For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. What fruit did you have then in the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death.

But now having been set free from sin, and having become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.



"Leading the Change: Women Shaping a Sustainable Future" Women's History Month 2026 - Religion

Notable Women in the Bible

Mary, also known as the Virgin Mary, was the mother of Jesus and a central figure in Christianity, revered for her faith, obedience, and role in salvation history. Mary was a first-century Jewish woman from Nazareth, betrothed to Joseph, and chosen by God to conceive Jesus through the Holy Spirit, remaining a virgin at the time of His birth (Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 1:26-38). She gave birth to Jesus in Bethlehem and, together with Joseph, raised Him in Nazareth. Mary was present at key events in Jesus' life, including His crucifixion, and was with the apostles after His ascension. Scholars suggest she was likely between 14 and 16 years old when she became pregnant, consistent with cultural norms of her time.

Deborah, the first female judge in the Bible, played a crucial role in the history of ancient Israel. She was a prophetess and the wife of Lapidoth, who held court under the Palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim. Deborah's leadership was recognized for its wisdom and divine calling, as she delivered God's message to Barak, the son of Abinoam, to lead the Israelites against the Canaanite oppressors. Her story is found in the Book of Judges, chapter 4 and 5, and it highlights her dual role as a judge and prophetess, demonstrating that women could hold significant authority in biblical times.


Ruth, was a woman used mightily by God, and her story is used to encourage millions. The Book of Ruth demonstrates the providence of God at work in the life of an individual, and it exalts family loyalty. It shows how a Gentile became part of the Davidic ancestry (Ruth 4:17-21); thus, Ruth is cited in the genealogy of Christ in Matthew 1:5.

A.M.E. Zion Female Bishops:

The Right Reverend Mildred "Bonnie" Hines, the first of five daughters—Renita, Marcia, Charlotte, and Maria (deceased)—born to Roscoe and JoAnn Gwyn Hines of Mount Airy, North Carolina, a rural, family town. Bishop Hines was elected in Atlanta, Georgia, on July 18, 2008 at the 48th General Conference of The African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church as the 98th bishop in the line of succession of The A.M.E. Zion Church. She is the first and only female to be elected to the episcopacy in the 222nd year history of the denomination and on February 20, 2013 she became the first female to head The A.M.E. Zion Church when she was elected President of the Board of Bishops.

Bishop Melanie Rogers-Miller. Bishop Miller, born five of six children to Harmon and Agnes Rogers, is a native of Paterson, NJ. Bishop Miller is an educator who taught graduate courses in higher education at Old Dominion and Ashford Universities and undergraduate studies at Old Dominion University. She was a secondary school Technology Education teacher. In August 2009, Bishop Miller was commissioned and served as a Chaplain in the United States Navy until July 2023, after attaining the rank of Lieutenant Commander. On July 27, 2024, Rev. Dr. Melanie Rogers Miller became the 110th Bishop in the line of succession and serves as the Presiding Prelate of the Western Episcopal District which includes the Alaska, California, Colorado, Oregon-Washington, and the Southwest Rocky Mountain conferences.


