

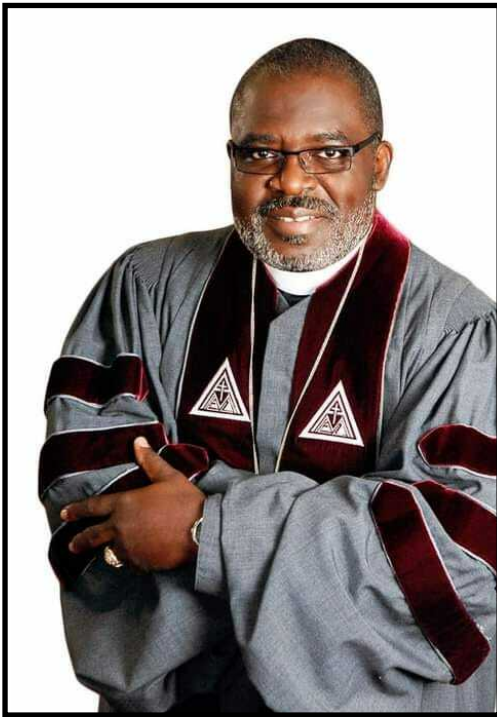

This quarter we thank God for ten new members. While we praise God for the growth we have experienced, we have been hit with a major blow. In a matter of one week, we have had three men to pass away, Mr. Richard Moore, Mr. Robert Keith Johnson, and Mr. Chris Caldwell. Within the month of September another member, Mr. S. M. Jordan, also passed. Our hearts go out to the families of these men who actively served our church for many years.

As always, I am thankful to my Ministerial staff, administrative staff, and the Officers of Little Rock for their constant support of our efforts. I could not do what I do without them being who they are. I am a blessed pastor!

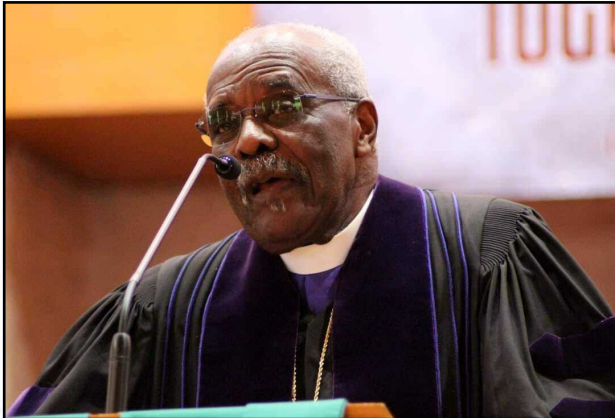

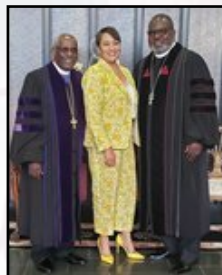

Guest Revivalist

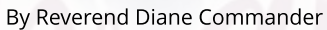


The original church property was purchased for a sum of four hundred and twenty-five dollars on May 31, 1884 (corrected deed filed June 10, 1893).

In 1906 under the Pastorate of Rev. W. R. Douglas, the frame structure was moved across Seventh Street. The brick edifice, which is now the Little Rock Cultural Center, was completed in 1911. The edifice was a blended manifestation of the turn of the century Greek and Romanesque architectural style. The old Little Rock Church building is a remarkable reminder of an exuberant expression of faith and commitment of God's people to God's Glory.

The new Sanctuary and Education wing were completed in October 1981. Rev. William White, who pastored Little Rock for 16 years, led members and friends in a reverent and stately procession from the Old Little Rock Church into the new edifice on Sunday, December 6, 1981. Rev. Dr. James R. Samuel followed Rev. William White and pastored Little Rock for 16 years, making improvements to the Church and Education Wing. Dr. Dwayne A. Walker was appointed Pastor and regained possession of the old church building in 2005. In 2006, he became the Founder of the Community Development Corporation, and through his excellent leadership, a partnership between the Little Rock Community Development Corporation and the Charlotte City Council was facilitated to build a 105 unit, five-story apartment building, "Varick on 7th" (where 52 of the units will be affordable housing).

Preparing for Active Participation

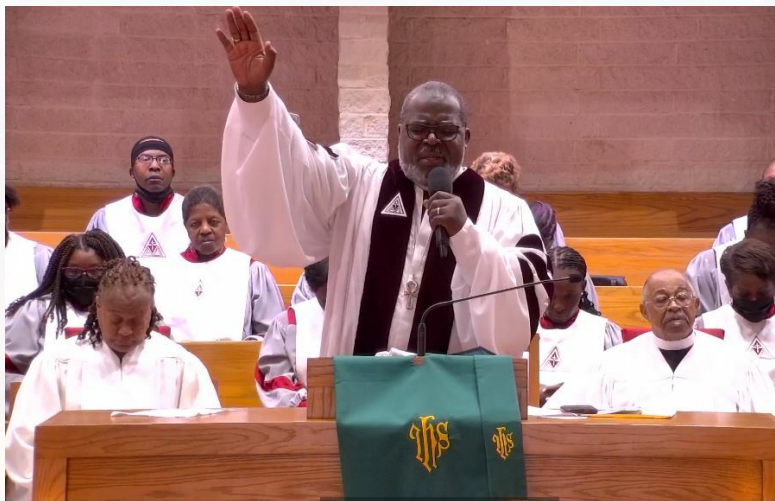

In the observance of the annual Connectional Lay Day, Rev. Dr. Dwayne A. Walker, Pastor of Little Rock A.M.E Zion Church in Charlotte, NC allowed Ms. Gloria Joyner Johnson, President of the local Lay Council to preside over the morning worship service as he and the ministerial staff worshiped from the pews along with the members in the congregation.

The responsive reading and affirmation of faith were led by Ms. Hazeline Smith and Ms. Jennifer Mitchell who serve as the local Lay Council First Vice-President and Secretary, respectively.

Dr. Mary S. Ponds, President of the Western North Carolina Lay Council was the speaker for the morning. A graduate of Livingstone College, Dr. Ponds was an educator in the public schools of Rowan County, NC and in Virginia. In 1999, she was elected the first woman and the first African American to be elected Mayor of Granite Quarry, NC.

She has served in many leadership roles in her community, county, state, and church, the White Rock AME Zion Church where Rev. Thomas Lee is the Pastor. She is the recipient of the Order of the Long Leaf Pine, the highest award given to civilians in the state of North Carolina. In 2020, she was elected the President of the WNCC Lay Council, an office she currently holds.

Using the current Connectional Theme Quadrant, "Sharing Our Faith," Dr. Ponds spoke on "What's Your Excuse?" The scriptural reference was Philemon 1:4-6. The Lay Council has many resources that may be used to share our faith, including but not limited to the Holy Bible, the Lay Affirmation, the Lay Logo (Come with Us to Christ), the scriptural reference (Proverbs 3:6), as well as the Lay Hymn and Song. We do not share our personal testimonies or experiences which are powerful. We must be more responsible to make disciples by being optimistic and share our faith and not be in violation of God's commandment to make disciples.

Together, we can be the change we want to see. Sharing our faith with others we encounter may not be comfortable, but we really have no excuse not to share.

After the worship service, an abbreviated stole ceremony was held at the altar. Mrs. Ruby Tarver, the local Second Vice President began this ceremony and called Ms. Jackie Abraham to the altar to receive her stole given by Dr. Ponds.

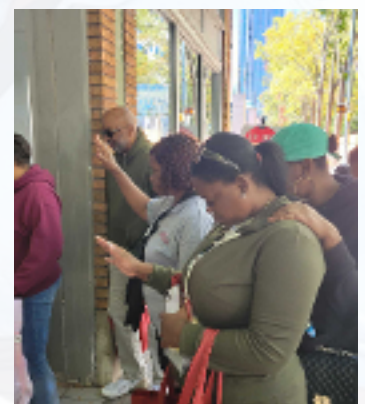
COMMUNITY PRAYER WALK

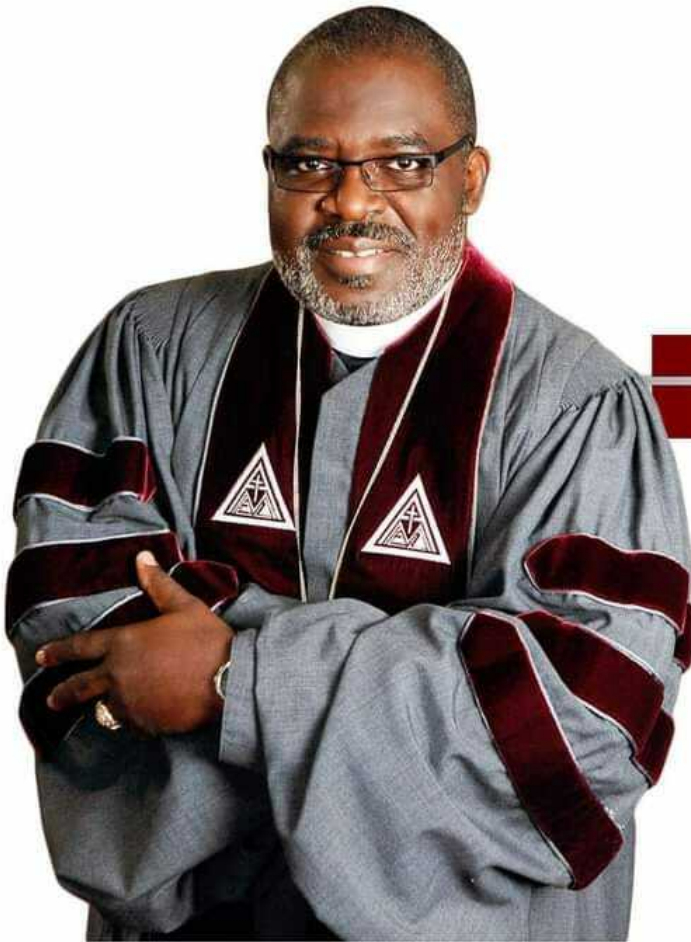
Fun! Food! Fellowship!
