

# LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

**OF THE BODY** AND CREMATED **REMAINS** 

Cremation is sometimes chosen as an option because of sanitary, economic or social PROPER BURIAL considerations. The Church raises no doctrinal objection to this practice, since cremation of the deceased's body does not affect his or her soul, nor does it prevent God, in his omnipotence, from raising up the deceased body to new life. Cremation does not negate neither the Christian doctrine of the soul's immortality nor that of the resurrection of the body. The Church continues to prefer the practice of burying the body of the deceased, because this shows a greater esteem towards the deceased.


# EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

NEXT Wednesday, August 15 After the noon Mass until the Benediction at 5:00 p.m.

Praying in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament outside of Mass has been a part of Catholic tradition for centuries. Although participation in the Eucharist at Mass is the "source and summit of the Christian life" (*Lumen Gentium*, 11) praying before the Eucharist after Mass continues the grace received at Mass and leads us into fuller participation at the Eucharistic table. The principal desire for Christ in instituting the Eucharist is to be with us as food, medicine and comfort. Spending time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament deepens our friendship with Jesus, which also leads to a more compassionate concern for other people. We will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Wednesday. August 15, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, from after the Noon Mass until the Benediction at 5:00 P.M. So as to be sure that there is someone in prayer during the whole time of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, there is a sign-up sheet in the church entrance.

#### INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**Exodus 16: 2-4, 12-15** The book of Exodus tells of the Israelites' escape from Egypt and their journey to Mt. Sinai some 1200 years before Christ, The bread described in today's reading is called *manna* a word derived from the ancient Hebrew word for "what is this?"

**Ephesians 4: 17, 20-24** In our consecutive readings from the letter to the Ephesians, we have come to a part of the letter which gives practical advice for daily living. Today's reading describes the effects of baptism. In the waters of baptism, we symbolically die to one way of living and rise to a new way of life.
