

LITURGICAL REFLECTION...

OF THE BODY AND CREMATED **REMAINS**

The Church continues to prefer the practice of burying the bodies of the deceased. The reason is PROPER BURIAL that this ancient Christian custom shows a greater esteem towards the deceased. Nevertheless, cremation is not prohibited, unless it is chosen for reasons contrary to Christian doctrine. In the absence of motives contrary to Christian doctrine, the Church after the celebration of the Funeral Mass or Funeral Liturgy outside Mass, accompanies the choice of cremation. The relevant liturgical rites are provided. And care is to be taken to avoid any appearance of religious indifference.

This Wednesday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. The Church commemorates that Mary, who bore the Incarnate and Risen Word in her womb, did not experience death and decay. Rather she is the first to share in her Son's resurrection. She is assumed into heaven body and soul. The first cathedral of the United States in Baltimore bears the title of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kings 19:4-8 The prophet Elijah lived about 800 years before Christ. Because he was loyal to God, he fell into disfavor with King Ahab and Queen Jezabel. He had to flee for his life to Mt. Horeb (also known as Mt. Sinai). Today's passage takes place at the beginning of his flight.

Ephesians 4:30 – 5:2 This part of the letter to the Ephesians contains more practical advice for Christian living. The author says that actions which cause division in a community are simply unacceptable. Today's reading points out mutual forgiveness is seen as essential for any group that calls itself Christian. There is an echo here of part of the Lord's prayer.
