

Ephesians 5: 15-20 Today's reading continues reflections on how to live as a Christian in everyday life. In the world in which the author lived, ignorance and addiction to alcohol were among the things that kept people from living a dignified life. The first-century author sets forth high expectations for Christians.

One fourth of the funds raised will stay in the local area through the work of the American Rescue Workers. The rest of the money will be given to the Church World Service to alleviate hunger in poor
