

# Liturgical Reflection

# DAY OF PRAYER

THIS **Tuesday**, **January 22**, all dioceses in the United States of America are observing a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, the day of the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision, Roe vs. Wade (1973). The Church in America prays for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and for the full restoration of the legal guarantee to the right to life. Members of the Diocese are encouraged to go to Mass on this day, pray the rosary, the chaplet of Divine Mercy, fast and abstain, and join the Altoona-Johnstown family in praying the following:

O God, who adorn creation with splendor and beauty, and fashion human lives in your image and likeness, awaken in every heart reverence for the work of your hands, and renew among your people a readiness to nurture and sustain your precious gift of human life. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

# INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

**Isaiah 62:1-5** The last part of the book of Isaiah contains the words of a prophet who lived after the Jews returned from exile in Babylon. When they returned, they found the temple destroyed and the city leveled. The prophet sees, however, a wonderful future for them because God loves them so much. Note the image to describe that love.

**1 Corinthians 12:4-11** Today, and for the next few weeks, we will hear selections from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. Corinth was a busy cosmopolitan seaport located in the central part of modern-day Greece. Here, Paul addresses problems his converts are experiencing in trying to live a Christian life in this non-Christian environment.

#### 2019 FREE SOUP SATURDAYS -ST. MICHAEL PARISH TO HOST SOON! We need your help and donations!



# THE RELIC OF ST JOHN VIANNEY

On Thursday, January 31, 2019, the relic of St. John Vianney (his entire incorrupt heart) will be in the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. The Shrine of Ars, France, has made this major relic available for a national tour in the U.S. The Knights of Columbus is hosting this tour and welcomes this special opportunity to offer for veneration this relic of the patron of parish priests, whose holiness and integrity is a model for clergy and laity alike. It will be placed there at the conclusion of the 6:45 AM Mass and remain throughout the day. The usual Mass schedule at the Cathedral (8:00 AM and 12:00 noon) will be observed and there will be a concelebrated Mass at 5:30 PM. The relic will remain in the Cathedral for a short time after Mass for private veneration (about 7:30 PM). Priests will be available throughout the day to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As we, as a diocese, prepare for the opportunity to venerate the relic of this great saint, please pray for his intercession for your intentions and the success of the visit of his incorrupt heart to our diocese. All are encouraged to participate and pray that this experience will be a time of conversion and pastoral renewal for everyone.
