Liturgical Reflection



The primary and original reason for reservation of the Eucharist outside Mass is the administration of viaticum. The secondary ends are the giving of communion to the sick and the adoration of our Lord Jesus Christ present in the Sacrament. The reservation of the Sacrament for the sick lead to the praiseworthy practice of adoring the heavenly Food that is reserved in churches. This cult of adoration has a sound and firm foundation, especially since faith in the real presence of the Lord has as its natural consequence the outward, public manifestation of belief in the real presence of the Lord found in the consecrated elements.

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19 Today we hear about Jeremiah's call to be a prophet. It came when he was quite young. It also came at a time of turmoil when Babylon was in the process of conquering the entire Near East. For these reasons, Jeremiah felt uneasy about the call, but God refuses to take "no" for an answer.

1 Corinthians 12:31 - 13:13 We will recognize today's passage from first Corinthians as one that is often read at weddings. Actually, the context is not marriage, but squabbles in the Christian community in Corinth over whose spiritual gifts were more important. Paul goes to the heart of the matter.

MASS PARTICIPATION

Mass attendance includes participation in the act of worship by praying (vocally and silently), listening, singing, and joining in physical rituals. The Liturgy of the Word is preceded by The Introductory Rites and the Liturgy of the Eucharist is followed by The Concluding Rites. The Mass begins and ends with the Sign of the Cross and so we are to remain for the whole Mass as mature Christians who take the time to worship God "in Spirit and in truth" ... John 4:24.

GLUTEN SENSITIVITY

There may be parishioners who have found that they have physical disorders related to gluten intolerance. The ordinary hosts distributed at Communion contain gluten. If you have found that you are gluten sensitive, special bread is available that possess a very low gluten content. Please tell the priest before Mass, and he will consecrate the low-gluten host for you to receive at that Mass.
