

FLU SEASON DIRECTIVES

Because of the seriousness of this flu season, Bishop Bartchak has asked that the Precious Blood of the Lord not be offered at Mass temporarily. It is the belief of the Catholic Church that the whole Body of Christ is present under either form of consecrated bread and wine. Also, the exchange of the sign of peace should avoid bodily contact. A reverent nod with eye contact and a smile will be the temporary practice. Reception of Holy Communion on the hand is encouraged; however, reception on the tongue may not be denied. These norms are in effect throughout the winter months or until the flu season is over.

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah 6:1-8 The prophet Isaiah lived about 750 years before Christ. His enthusiastic response to God's call led to a prophetic career that lasted over 40 years. In this brief passage, we find not only the source for the "Holy, Holy" in Mass, but also the prayer before reading the Gospel (asking God to cleanse ones lips), and finally the refrain from a frequently used contemporary hymn.

1 Corinthians 15:1-11 We continue our reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthian. Some members of the community had questioned the bodily resurrection of Jesus, and our own resurrection as well. This passage is Paul's response. It pre-dates the Gospels and is the oldest written record of the Church's core tradition about Christ's resurrection.
