INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Isaiah 50: 4-7 Chapters 40 – 55 of the Book of Isaiah contain the message of a prophet who spoke to God's people during their exile in Babylon. Several times the prophet speaks about a servant who will one day deliver God's people. Because the servant is portrayed as suffering, Christians have traditionally identified Jesus with this suffering servant.

Philippians 2: 6-11 In the years following Christ's death and resurrection, Christians began to develop the prayers and hymns that would become part of their rituals. In today's passage from the letter to the Philippians, Paul appears to be quoting an early Christian hymn celebrating the dying and rising of Christ.

Palm Sunday - Year A (2020)

FR. ALAN'S REMOTE HOMILY

Above the corpus, the body, on practically every crucifix, we will find the letters, INRI. These are the first letters of four Latin words: *Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudæorum*. These words translate the Greek of John's gospel regarding the placard that was hung on the cross above Jesus' head: *Jesus of Nazareth, king of the Jews*.

Each of the gospels relates this story about a placard of the charges against Jesus being hung on the cross. What is interesting to me is that not one of the gospels has the charge worded the same way. Mark, the shortest of all the gospels, has the shortest statement, "The king of the Jews." Luke adds a single word, "this." "This is the king of the Jews." Matthew and John have longer statements. For Matthew, the charge against Jesus is "This is Jesus the King of the Jews."

What Matthew describes is the revolutionary act that the Romans feared: there were to be no rivals to Caesar, the emperor of Rome. There could be only one king. The whole crucifixion scene screams, "This is what we will do with those who oppose us."

Matthew, however, may be operating on some other levels as well. We Christians believe that what the placard, described by Matthew, proclaims is, ironically, really true: This *is* the king of the Jews and of everyone else as well. In the last parable Jesus tells in Matthew's gospel, he says that when he, the Son of Man, comes again, he will come as a king. On Palm Sunday we join the crowd of Jesus' disciples in Jerusalem in welcoming him as the King who is to come. But he is a king like no other. He comes riding a donkey of peace rather than a horse of war. As David had been a shepherd-king, Jesus too is a shepherd-king, but he infinitely exceeds David. He gives his life for his people.

By inserting the name "Jesus" into the wording of the placard, Matthew tells us still more. It is Matthew who, at the beginning of his gospel describes the plight of the expectant Virgin Mary and the inner turmoil of Joseph, her just and faithful husband. When the angel of the Lord reveals the plan of God to Joseph, he is told that he will name the child to be born Jesus because "he will save his people from their sins." In fact, the name Jesus is a Greek name which comes from a shortened version of the name Joshua and means, "God saves." This is just what Jesus, the King, is doing on the cross.

As we acclaim the One who comes triumphantly into Jerusalem let us identify him by name: Jesus. He comes to complete the plan that his very name signifies. He comes as God to save his people, including us, from our sins.
