INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Leviticus 13: 1-2, 44-46 The third book of the Bible, Leviticus, is a collection of Jewish laws. Old Testament people believed that being clean or unclean (that is kosher or non-kosher) was based on what was considered to be normal or abnormal. For example, because a snake slithered on the ground rather than walked, it was considered abnormal, and therefore unclean. By the same standards, people with disabilities or deformities were seen as unclean. We see a particular case addressed in today's reading.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthian 10: 31-11:1 Today's passage concludes a long section of First Corinthians in which Paul has been addressing disputes between Jewish Christians and Gentile Christians about what foods are kosher. Paul now makes a general observation that while we may in principal be free to do this or that, we should avoid those things that disrupt harmony and peace.

Next Sunday's Readings: Genesis 9:8-15 and 1 Peter 3:18-22; Gospel: Mark 1:12-15

PARISH PAINTING PROJECT UPDATE

This week the ceiling was primed and painted with two coats of bright white paint. The painting committee met with the pastoral and finance council members to discuss some changes to the original design; in particular the painting design behind the statues of the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph & the child Jesus. The new design will be a solid filled arched area of the wine color that was previously approved that will extend to the floor. Around this will be a gold border that will mimic that around the stained glass windows. Samples of the border will be painted this week for some minor approval in details. The Scaffolding that has filled the church is also scheduled to come down this week.

ASH WEDNESDAY

This Wednesday, February 17, is Ash Wednesday when the Church begins the forty day journey toward the Triduum (The Three Days) with the annual discipline of fasting, praying and giving alms. Ash Wednesday (February 17) and Good Friday (April 2) are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence. FASTING refers to only one full meal, with two small meals and no eating otherwise for the day. ABSTINENCE refers to not eating meat at all during the day. All who have reached their 14th year are obliged to ABSTAIN. The Church directs the holy FAST to all those in their 18-year until their 60-year (Canon 1252). The ancient practice of fasting and abstaining can occur throughout other days in Lent. This is not obligatory and can take a variety of forms distinct from food.

ST. VALENTINE?

There were two people who gave February 14th the name of Valentine's Day. The first Valentine apparently performed many marriages that were against the emperor's wishes in the Third Century. The emperor wanted men to join the army rather than marry. The second Valentine was apparently imprisoned for helping the Christians. He is said to have loved the jailer's daughter and even cured her of blindness. From prison, he wrote her many love notes and would always sign them "From Your Valentine." Both Valentine's are closely associated with love relationships. Strangely enough, it is also said that both were put to death on the same day-February 14th.
