

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS

FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

Genesis 9:8-15 Today's reading from Genesis takes place after the story of Noah and the great flood. Israelite people of long ago saw the rainbow as a symbol of a Warrior-God hanging up his hunting bow as a peaceful gesture. The rainbow symbolizes the solemn promise that God made to Noah.

1 Peter 3:18-22 This reading reminds us that just as Noah was saved through the ark, we are saved through Baptism. Early Christians believed that those who died before the coming of Jesus awaited redemption in a shadowy existence described here as a prison. When we say in the Apostles Creed that "Jesus descended into hell," we are saying that Jesus went to announce to those waiting in that "prison" that they had been saved.

Next Sunday's Readings: Genesis 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18 and Romans 8:31-34; Gospel: Mark 9:2-10


PARISH PAINTING PROJECT UPDATE

This week the ceiling was trimmed with a gold accent band. The walls of the church were prepped and prepared for priming. Unfortunately more areas of weak plaster were discovered on the walls and the plasters will be called back in to fix those areas. Several samples of the border have been painted for the painting committee to review, and the scaffolding that has filled the church has been removed. Light fixtures have been repainted as well. Detail work on the area surrounding the Sanctuary work is just about complete.

This week the church will be cleaned (lots of dust from the plasters) and the pews and carpet recovered before work continues.

FAMILIES AND THE GOSPEL

First Sunday of Lent (Mark 1:12-15) Jesus went into the desert to put his life in perspective. This Lent, take a fresh look at a difficult relationship in your life. Concentrate on the positive things that person does, not just the negatives. Try to understand why their behaviors "bug" you. Can you honestly share your feelings with them without attacking them? Make Lent a time to MEND and FORGIVE!

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today's readings remind us that "baptism is God's most beautiful and magnificent gift" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church; 1216*). In your Lenten Journey, May you re-commit yourself to living as Jesus' disciple and a passionate steward of all God's gifts in the kingdom of God. We should strive to fully participate in this Lenten season by mirroring Jesus, the model steward by whom we are called to imitate. Through our time in the desert, we will confront evil by weeding out the roots of sin in our lives through fasting. May we be sustained and nourished in the desert by prayer. May we also model ourselves after Saint Joseph who was a creative hardworking and courageous child of God. We must strive to be the caretakers of all the sons and daughters who are in need of food, clothing, shelter, security and safety. YEAR OF SAINT JOSEPH



On December 8, 2020, the 150th Anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron Saint of the Universal Church, Pope Francis issued the Apostolic Letter Patris Corde (With a Father's Heart) as an extended reflection of the holy foster father of Jesus and spouse of Mary. Written in the backdrop of the Covid-19 Pandemic he shares, "Saint Joseph devoted himself as a father in varied ways: beloved, tender and loving, obedient, accepting, creatively courageous, working, and "in the shadows."

Because of Pope Francis' deep devotion to Saint Joseph, he also announced on December 8 that the Church would be celebrating a Year of Saint Joseph, "which would take place for one year up to December 8, 2021. This is to be a special year with a special focus of the Church's prayers and activities devoted to Saint Joseph. This year can also be a special year for those in need of Saint Joseph's healing intercession in their relationship with their own father. It will be a year of discovery and growth for all. LISTENING TO GOD

"Prayer without listening, without meditation, is like picking up the telephone, dialing God, and saying, 'Hey God, I have this problem' and then hanging up...without even waiting for an answer," says Susan Dobson, an entertainment producer and business manager.

"Now I slow down and sit still and go to my house of prayer within." God speaks to us in many ways. We have to slow down to listen.

Trappist monk Father Thomas Keating says, "God's first language is silence and everything else is translation." And so "when one allows oneself to be really still, beyond thinking," he says that allows us to grasp "an intuitive sense of a deeper presence than ourselves."

It's possible to listen to God with our heart; to listen in the sights, sounds and beauty of the natural world.

In the "Way of Perfection" (xvii), St. Teresa refers to the habit of conversing often with God, something which she says we shouldn't be embarrassed to do. "Be confident that He will suggest to your heart what to say." "Be still, and know that I am God. (*Ps.6:10*)
