

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS

The Baptism of the Lord

First Reading: Isaiah 55:1-11 Today's reading is from a part of Isaiah written when the Jewish people were exiled in Babylon, which is in modern-day Iraq. This section is often referred to as the "book of comfort" because of the encouragement it gives. Today's passage is the finale to this "book of comfort" and uses the image of poor people being invited by God to a joyful banquet.

Second Reading: 1John 5:1-9 In this passage, the author of the first letter of John emphasizes belief in Jesus Christ as Son of God. He uses phrases and symbols which describe Christ's baptism, death and resurrection. The Spirit, present at these events, testifies to Christ as Son of God. Such testimony is far superior to any human witness.

Next Sunday's Readings: 1 Samuel 3:3b-10,19 and 1 Cor. 6:13c –15a, 17-20; Gospel: John 1:35-42

FAMILIES & THE GOSPEL





WHAT IS MEDITATION?

Meditation is a Christian practice of prayer dating back to the early Church. As the Catechism states: "Meditation is above all a quest. The mind seeks to understand the why and how of the Christian life, in order to adhere and respond to what the Lord is asking." By meditating on the Gospels, holy icons, liturgical texts, spiritual writings, or "the great book of creation," we come to make our own that which is God's. "To the extent that we are humble and faithful, we discover in meditation the movements that stir the heart and we are able to discern them. It is a question of acting truthfully in order to come into the light: "Lord, what do you want me to do?" (CCC 2705-2706). Meditation is above all a quest.

Meditation is an essential form of Christian prayer, especially for those who are seeking to answer the vocational question, "Lord, what do you want me to do?"
