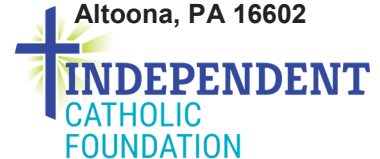

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS
Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Nehemiah 8: 2-4a, 5-6,8-10 The book of Nehemiah recounts events which happened about 100 years after the Jewish people had returned from the Babylon exile. After their initial religious fervor, the people's moral life and commitment to the God's law had lapsed. So Ezra the priest challenged the people to renew their commitment to the law and conducted what is today a "religious revival".

1Corinthians 12: 12-30 Today we continue our reading from the first letter of Paul to the Christians in Corinth, an important seaport. He was answering a letter they wrote to him, containing questions about Christian life in their community. Among the questions was how to deal with the diversity of gifts within the community, and the rivalries and jealousies that inevitably arise. He responds by using an image that the Catholic Church has particularly emphasized.

- When we forget about God, do things go bad?

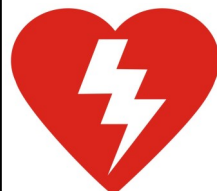

Help with your overdue water bill



LIHWAP may be able to assist you with
overdue water and wastewater bills.

What is LIHWAP?

The Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is a temporary emergency program to help low-income families pay overdue water bills. LIHWAP is a grant. You do not have to repay it.

To receive help...

- Apply starting January 4, 2022.
- You don't have to be on public assistance.
- You need to have an unpaid water bill.
- You can either rent or own your home.

How does LIHWAP work?

LIHWAP Crisis grants may be available if you have an emergency situation and are in jeopardy of losing your water service. You can receive one Crisis grant for your drinking water service and one Crisis grant for your wastewater service, up to \$2,500 each.

Crisis situations include:

- Past-due water bills.
- Termination of utility service.
- Danger of having utility service terminated (received a notice that service will be shut off within the next 60 days).

How do I apply?

- Apply online at www.compass.state.pa.us.
- Request an application by calling the Statewide Customer Service Center at 877-395-8930 or call PA Relay at 711 for the hearing impaired.
- Applications are available at your local county assistance office.

To apply, you will need:

- Names of people in your household;
- Dates of birth for all household members;
- Social Security numbers for all household members;
- Proof of income for all household members; and
- A recent water bill.

Who is eligible?

You may qualify for a LIHWAP grant if:

- You must have an overdue water bill that you are responsible for paying.
- Your household income meets the following income guidelines:
