INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS

Deuteronomy 30:10-14 The events in this reading take place as the Israelites are camped on the shore of the Jordan River, ready to enter the Promised Land. Moses makes it clear to the people that they are expected to remain faithful to the Lord after they have settled in their new land.

Colossians 1:15-20 Today and for the next three Sundays, the second reading will be from the letter to the Colossians. This letter responds to a widespread belief that God ruled the world through the meditation of angels who were given their own powers. The author quotes an early Christian hymn that emphasizes that Jesus is the one and only mediator between God and the world.
