

## **INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS**

**Proverbs 8:22-31** The book of Proverbs is mostly a collection of wise sayings to help people live a good life. Today's passage from Proverbs, however, is a hymn to Wisdom which in the Old Testament is sometimes symbolically described as a person coming from God.

**Romans 5:1-5** Paul's letter to the Romans is his most detailed and important theological work. The Church chose this brief passage to be read on Trinity Sunday because, in these five verses, all three persons of the Trinity are mentioned.

You are invited to join us on:


Sunday, July 7 at the Hollidaysburg American Legion Park for our Parish's Annual Outdoor Field Mass and Picnic.
