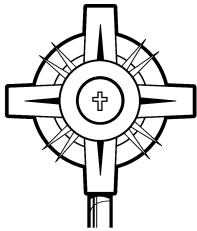

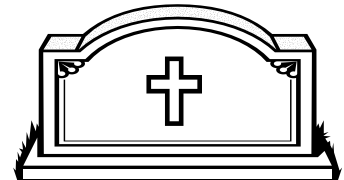

Stewardship Reflection

The First Reading from the Book of Wisdom explains to us the importance of striving to understand the mysteries of faith. However, the great challenge is the action, living it out in our daily lives. That demonstrates wisdom.

Today's second reading speaks clearly of Christian stewardship, “out of his richness, Jesus became poor, and through his poverty, he became rich.” Share all your gifts in justice and love. You allow others to meet their needs by denying yourself of your wants.

The idea of “free will” can be a bit of a burden. Like Jesus Himself, Paul makes it clear that people are able to exercise free will in what they give and what they share. Whether we are disciples and whether we practice stewardship, or not, is a matter of personal choice. Yet Jesus did “command” us to love one another. If we are really striving to do just that, it is difficult to do it without being a good steward.

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS The Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wisdom 1:13-15, 2:23-24 The book of Wisdom was addressed to a group of Jews living in Alexandria, Egypt. It begins with a sharp contrast between good and evil. In the pagan world of that time, most people believed that there were good gods and bad gods. The author emphasizes the Jewish belief that there is just one God who is the source only of goodness and life.

2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15 Today's excerpt from Second Corinthians paints a picture of Paul the pastor at work. The Jewish people in Jerusalem who had become Christian were a small minority and were being persecuted. This brought on financial hardships. Paul wants his Gentile converts in Greece to help them out and show that the bonds of Christianity cut across ethnic lines.
