### tewardship Reflection

The First Reading from the Book of Wisdom explains to us the importance of striving to understand the mysteries of faith. However, the great challenge is the action, living it out in our daily lives. That demonstrates wisdom.

Today's second reading speaks clearly of Christian stewardship, "out of his richness, Jesus became poor, and through his poverty, he became rich." Share all your gifts in justice and love. You allow others to meet their needs by denying yourself of your wants.

The idea of "free will" can be a bit of a burden. Like Jesus Himself, Paul makes it clear that people are able to exercise free will in what they give and what they share. Whether we are disciples and whether we practice stewardship, or not, is a matter of personal choice. Yet Jesus did "command" us to love one another. If we are really striving to do just that, it is difficult to do it without being a good steward. (Stewardship Reflection, Catholic Stewardship Consultants, Inc. 2015/6/28)

### A Beloved Father, Glory of Domestic Life

Saint Joseph served God and his plan of salvation by being a faithful husband and father, day by day, week by week, and month by month. By doing these ordinary tasks out of love for his family, he made an offering of himself. "Joseph was the responsible and tender man who takes care of Mary and Jesus. He watches over them, helps them in their needs, gives himself to his daily tasks, sings the Psalms as the Jews of his time, dances with the words of the *Torah*, participates in the *Shabbat*, and leads Jesus to the synagogue. He rejoices interiorly when Jesus calls him *abba*, dear dad. Even though he knows in the depths of his silence that Jesus must serve another *Abba*."

### INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS The Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**Wisdom 1:13-15, 2:23-24** The book of Wisdom was addressed to a group of Jews living in Alexandria, Egypt. It begins with a sharp contrast between good and evil. In the pagan world of that time, most people believed that there were good gods and bad gods. The author emphasizes the Jewish belief that there is just one God who is the source only of goodness and life.

**2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15** Today's excerpt from Second Corinthians paints a picture of Paul the pastor at work. The Jewish people in Jerusalem who had become Christian were a small minority and were being persecuted. This brought on financial hardships. Paul wants his Gentile converts in Greece to help them out and show that the bonds of Christianity cut across ethnic lines.
