

## **INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS**

**Wisdom 11:22, 12:2** The book of Wisdom was written by a teacher who lived in Alexandria, Egypt, a center for Greek philosophy in the ancient world. It was written about 50 years before Christ, and was the last book of the Old Testament to be written. After the first verse of today's passage, the author speaks directly to God and does so in poetic fashion.

**2 Thessalonians 1:11, 2:2** In his *first* letter to the Thessalonians, Paul told them always to be prepared for the Lord's coming in glory. Some of them became preoccupied with the date when the Lord would come. The *second* letter to this community addresses that situation.

### PRAY FOR VOCATIONS

Pray the first decade for the priest who baptized you, the second decade for the priest who gave you First Communion, the third for the priest or bishop who confirmed you, the fourth for the priest who witnessed your marriage or religious vows, (or the bishop who ordained you), and the fifth for the priest who will anoint you before death.

#### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

The most important point about how much you choose to give of your treasure is how you reach the decision. Stewardship of treasure is about prayerful consideration. The amount you give should be an honest expression before God of who you are. It should be an offering that opens your heart, mind and soul to God's joy and holiness.
