Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a process for adults interested in learning more about the Catholic faith in order to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

This process is for all women and men who are not baptized or baptized in another Christian church but in need of further instruction or initiation, or those baptized in the Catholic Church but needing more instruction to complete the sacraments of initiation.

Persons never baptized are referred to as catechumens, while those previously baptized are called candidates.

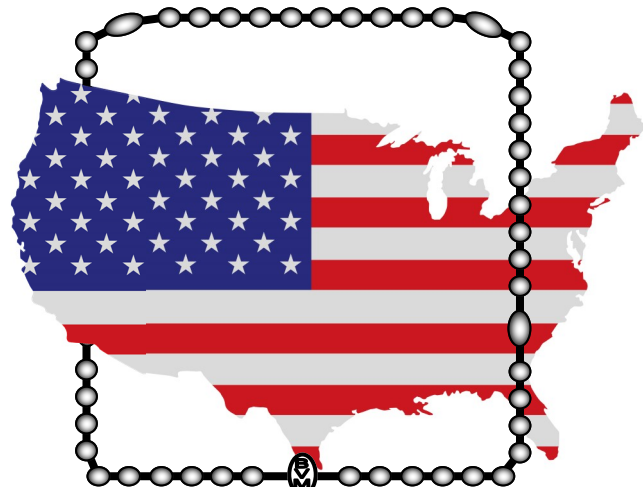

**A Working Father**

An aspect of Saint Joseph that has been emphasized by the Church from the time of the first social Encyclical *Rerum Novarum*, written by Pope Leo XIII, is his relation to work. St. Joseph was a carpenter who earned an honest living to provide for his family. From him, Jesus learned the value, the dignity and the joy of what it means to eat bread that is the fruit of one's own labor. "He came down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them...And Jesus advanced in wisdom, age and favor before God and man." (Lk 2:51-52)

In our own day, when employment has once more become a burning social issue, and unemployment at times reaches record levels even in nations that for decades have enjoyed a certain degree of prosperity, there is a renewed need to appreciate the importance of dignified work, of which Saint Joseph is an exemplary patron.
