

## INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS

#### THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

**Exodus 34:4b-6,8-9** When Moses saw the Israelite people worshipping the golden calf, he angrily threw down and broke the tablets containing the Commandments. Later, God instructed him to cut two new tablets. This passage begins at that point and offsets the mistaken notion that the Old Testament always presents a stern and angry God.

**2 Corinthians 13:11-13** This passage is the ending of Paul's second letter to the Corinthians. The Church chose this passage for Trinity Sunday because it mentions all three persons of the Trinity. The passage also contains a familiar greeting we hear at the beginning of Mass.

# PUBLIC MASSES RESUME NEXT WEEKEND JUNE 13 & 14

Beginning **THIS Saturday**, **June 13**, all Masses in the Altoona-Johnstown Diocese will once again be public. Masses here at St. Michael and at St Mary's will be celebrated at the normal times and in the normal locations. We will have to observe the six-foot rule of nonmembers of the same household, hand sanitizing, and (if able) the wearing of nose and mouth coverings. If we run out of space for people in the church itself, we will use the church hall where people can watch Mass and receive Holy Communion. (We are asking that you do not sit in the choir loft.) For those uncomfortable with coming into the enclosed space of the church, we'll continue to video record the Mass and have it on our parish website, and we will distribute Holy Communion after each Mass for the time being. (See times and schedule on next page.)

Parishioners who have volunteered to help serve as Ministers of Hospitality will assist you in finding a place to sit, and will help with traffic flow for communion and for exiting the church. We will use a modified procedure for distributing Holy Communion. This will help us observe the six-foot rule and avoid inadvertent contact. We will also change the way we exit from Mass. We would like all those who are physically able to use the front entrance of the church, keeping a distance from others who are exiting. The side entrance will be reserved for the physically challenged. When they have exited at the end of Mass, we will distribute Holy Communion at the side door of the church. Please use care in the parking lot since we will likely have people walking to and from the side door for Holy Communion. Thank you for you patience and cooperation.

## HOLY COMMUNION OUTSIDE OF MASS

Holy Communion will continue to be distributed outside of Mass at the church side door. Communicants are asked to be prepared spiritually, if possible wear a facial mask, and keep social distancing if you do not reside in the same household. (See complete times and schedule on next page.) We will continue to distribute Communion this way even once public Mass begins on June 13. For those who do not feel comfortable being in the church just yet, and would rather a household member or an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion bring you Communion to your home, please contact the parish office for arrangements. You're under no obligation to come for Communion, so please be reasonable in protecting your own health and the health of others.

## **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

For the reopening of the church we will need the help of **many** volunteers. Please read over the specific needs listed below to discern where and how you may be able to help:

Ministers of Hospitality: We will need multiple Ministers of Hospitality at all weekend Masses. They will be trained to help assist in seating people in compliance with the six-foot rule and keep people spaced apart during Holy Communion. They'll also distribute bulletins at the end of Mass. If you had previously been an usher, and you're willing to take the risk of coming to weekend Masses, then we could really use your help. Obviously new volunteers will also be needed. There will be a training session for ministers of hospitality THIS Saturday, June 13, at 10:00 am at St. Michael's Church.

<u>Volunteers to help clean pews</u>: We need multiple volunteers to help clean the church between weekend Masses. Pews will need to be sprayed and wiped down, door handles cleaned and so on. Please contact the parish office if you would be willing to perform this work of charity. Be sure to let us know which Mass you will normally be attending.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: We will also need a sufficient number of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. We'll need help at Mass itself. Communion will be under the form of bread only, but it's helpful to have a second minister at Mass. It will also be helpful if ministers of Holy Communion can be available to help distribute Communion after Mass. More importantly, though, we're going to need people who are willing to take Holy Communion to the sick, the fearful, the homebound, and anyone who is unable to come to the church. If you have family members in these conditions, perhaps you'd be willing to volunteer. A training session for all who choose to continue as ministers of Holy Communion as well as those who would like to take on this ministry will be THIS Saturday, June 13, at 11:00 am at St. Michael's Church. If you'd like to participate in this important work but these times don't work for you, give the parish office a call to arrange for a private training session.

# STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION The Most Holy Trinity Sunday

"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son." (Jn 3:16) May we, as Christian disciples and stewards, always give of ourselves as a grateful response for his perfect gift.

Living as a Christian at this time in history we are reminded daily that we can greet everyone with the peace of Christ through our prayer, a kind word of encouragement, or a simple donation of food, time, or money. If even one other person can see the face of God in us then we are bringing to them the belief in God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, and that they indeed can have eternal life through the saving act of Jesus Christ.

# HOLY TRINITY FAMILY ACTIVITIES

- Depending on the ages of family members, research symbols of the Trinity and create something for the centerpiece of your family table, or something for your family altar, such as a small banner or poster. It can be as little as a 4 x 6 photograph or something to use every year as a backdrop or wall hanging.
- Think of different foods to serve that can reflect the symbolism of the Trinity. One example is clover leaf rolls. These rolls are formed with three balls of dough put into one hole of the muffin tin for each roll. They are easy to make. Use your favorite roll recipe (you can even buy frozen bread or roll dough), or search on the Internet for one of many examples.
- The Directory on Popular Piety explains some of the pious exercises related to the devotion of the Holy or Blessed Trinity. Three very simple prayers are the Sign of the Cross, Gloria Patri (Glory be to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, etc.) and the Trisagion (meaning "thrice holy"): "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy on us." This is just one version, there are many others.
