

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS

Fourth Sunday of Easter

Acts 2: 14, 36-41 In last Sunday's reading from the Act of the Apostles, we heard a portion of Peter's sermon at the first Pentecost. Today's passage gives the last part of that sermon and the reaction of those who heard it.

1 Peter 2: 20-25 Today's passage from the First Letter of Peter was addressed to Christian slaves who were being treated harshly by their pagan masters. The author reminds them that they are members of the flock whose shepherd walked ahead of them in the face of insults and unjust treatment.

Pope Francis recently encouraged Catholics to pray the rosary throughout May. He also shared two new prayers to implore the help of the Virgin Mary during the coronavirus pandemic.

"Contemplating the face of Christ with the heart of Mary our Mother will make us even more united as a spiritual family and will help us overcome this time of trial," Pope Francis said in a letter April 25.

He urged families and individuals to "rediscover the beauty of praying the rosary at home in the month of May," which is traditionally a time of increased devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

With his letter, the pope included two prayers to Our Lady to recite at the end of the rosary, which he said he would also pray throughout May "in spiritual union with all of you." (see insert in today's bulletin)

In his letter, Francis said people can pray the rosary as a group or individually, whatever fits their situation best. "The key to doing this is always simplicity."

During May, it is a tradition to pray the rosary "at home within the family," he said, noting that the restrictions of the COVID-19 pandemic "have made us come to appreciate all the more this 'family' aspect, also from a spiritual point of view."

Pope Francis concluded his letter by saying "I keep all of you in my prayers, especially those suffering most greatly, and I ask you, please, to pray for me."

WILL THE CHURCH REOPEN SOON?

As our state begins the transition to reopen, county by county, we will soon be able to reopen the church. At this point we don't really know what "opening" means. Meetings are being held daily to discuss this and to explore all options that will meet both your safety and spiritual needs. Decisions will be made following the guidelines issued by the governor, the CDC and under the guidance of Bishop Mark. We will announce any changes, as they happen, to our current situation on our Website and Facebook page. In the meantime, Fr. Alan will continue say Mass privately daily and video record the weekend Mass.

Protect those doctors, nurses, health workers, and volunteers who are on the frontline of this emergency, and are risking their lives to save others. Support their heroic effort and grant them strength, generosity, and continued health.

Be close to those who assist the sick night and day, and to priests who, in their pastoral concern and fidelity to the Gospel, are trying to help and support everyone.

Blessed Virgin, illumine the minds of men and women engaged in scientific research, that they may find effective solutions to overcome this virus.

Support national leaders, that with wisdom, solicitude, and generosity they may come to the aid of those lacking the basic necessities of life and may devise social and economic solutions inspired by farsightedness and solidarity.

Mary Most Holy, stir our consciences, so that the enormous funds invested in developing and stockpiling arms will instead be spent on promoting effective research on how to prevent similar tragedies from occurring in the future.

Beloved Mother, help us realize that we are all members of one great family and to recognize the bond that unites us, so that, in a spirit of fraternity and solidarity, we can help to alleviate countless situations of poverty and need. Make us strong in faith, persevering in service, constant in prayer.

Mary, Consolation of the afflicted, embrace all your children in distress and pray that God will stretch out his all-powerful hand and free us from this terrible pandemic, so that life can serenely resume its normal course.

To you, who shine on our journey as a sign of salvation and hope, do we entrust ourselves, O Clement, O Loving, O Sweet Virgin Mary. Amen.

FAMILIES AND THE GOSPEL

John 10:1-10 In today's gospel Jesus tells us, HE IS THE WAY and warns anyone who offers "another way" to happiness is "a thief and a bandit." Strong words! Don't listen to the sales pitch of society for happiness. Look to yourself where God is present and "calls you by name and leads you to abundant life."

TALENTS AND GIFTS IN THE FAMILY

Respect for self and others.

When we concentrate on the wonderful gifts our children bring to the family, rather than on "problems," we are apt to be better parents. Helping our children view themselves in positive ways boosts their self-esteem. Children (and adults) who value themselves value other people. They have much more potential to be peacemakers in our troubled world. Below is a suggestion of an activity you can do with your family this week to help direct focus for each family member's gift to the family.

 Everyone can do some things well. We call them gifts. Make a family talent/ gifts chain. Cut strips of colored construction paper, the same number for each member of the family. Choose a different color for each family member.

Discuss things each member of the family does well. Include ways they contribute to life of the family, such as a good sense of humor to taking out the garbage willingly. Write one of these talents or contributions on each strip of construction paper. Be sincere about the compliments represented.

Form one of the strips of paper into a circle and staple or tape the ends together. Form a circle with a strip from another member of the family and "thread" it through the first circle, forming a new "link". Tape or staple it together. Continue until all the strips you have written on are included.
