The Permanent Deacon



The Permanent Diaconate

has been a restored Office of the Church since 1968.

Who and What's a Deacon?

A Deacon is an ordained minister of the Catholic Church. There are three groups, or Orders of ordained ministers in the Church:

Bishops, Priests (presbyters) and Deacons.

Deacons are ordained as a sacramental sign to the Church and to the world of Christ, who came "to serve and not to be served." The entire Church is called by Christ to serve, and the Deacon, in virtue of his sacramental ordination and through his various ministries, is to be a servant in a servant-Church.

What are these "various ministries" of the Deacon?

All ordained ministers in the Church are called to functions of Word, Sacrament, Prayer and Charity; but Bishops, Priests and Deacons exercise these functions in various ways.

As ministers of Word, Deacons:

- Proclaim the Gospel
- Preach and teach in the name of the Church
- Provide spiritual direction and counsel

As ministers of Sacrament and Prayer, Deacons:

- Baptize
- Witness marriages
- Function as ORDINARY ministers of the Eucharist
- Assist Priests and Bishops at Mass
- Lead the faithful in prayer and Eucharistic Devotions
- Assist with Christian Burial by conducting Vigils, Services without a Mass, and Committals

As ministers of Charity, Deacons:

- Are leaders in identifying the needs of others,
- then marshalling the Church's resources to meet those needs.

Deacons however, are not able to:

- Offer Mass
- Hear Confessions
- Anoint the sick

These ministries remain those reserved to Priests.

The extent that the Deacon does these various things depends of course on their schedule and availability.

It is important to note that these roles and ministries of the Deacon are the norm, not the exception.

In other words, these are not things the Deacon does "if the Priest is not available," etc., but rather, things that he can and normally should do by virtue of his office.

In this way, although his Office is different from that of the Priest, it is also one that is shared with the Priest.

Together, the Pastor and Deacon share the total pastoral, sacramental, and teaching ministry of the Church.

The Attire and Title of the Permanent Deacon:

Although very similar, the vestments of the Deacon and those of the Priest are different. Both wear a white alb. However, the colored stole of the Deacon is worn diagonally while that of the Priest is worn vertically. The outer garment of the Deacon is called a dalmatic and it has sleeves. That of the Priest is called a chasuble and does not have sleeves.

The proper formal non-liturgical attire for a Priest is of course the clerical collar. That of the Deacon is normally a tie and jacket. Sometimes the Deacon wears a lapel pin, which is a cross with a diagonal stole on top of it. This is the symbol of the office of the Permanent Diaconate.

Just as a Priest is normally addressed as "Father...", the Deacon is addressed as "Deacon..." Also, the title "Reverend" is not used for Deacons.

An outdoor prayer service is planned for 2:00 PM with a reception to continue until 4:00 PM.

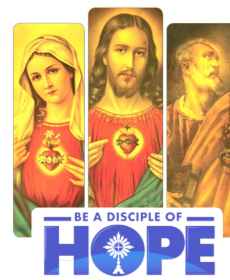

Stewardship Reflection

God called Amaziah from his daily life to carry forth a mission. Jesus commissioned the 12 apostles to preach the Gospel. He gives them the authority they need to do so, and sends them forth. In the second reading St. Paul praises the Lord and reminds us that it is "God whose chose us in Him, before the foundation of the world."

Like Amaziah and the 12 apostles, each one of us has been called to carry out a mission, to be a Christian disciple and proclaim the Gospel in all we say and do. He has given us everything that we need to do that. Every gift we have comes by way of gift from the Lord.

It is our responsibility to make the choice to recognize those gifts and to use them for God's purposes, to give glory to God through sharing our time, talent and treasures with all those in need.

Amos 7:12-15 Amos preached about 750 years before Christ and was the first prophet whose words were put into writing. At the time, the Jewish people were split into two kingdoms: Israel in the north and Judah in the south. Amos was not a prophet by occupation, but was sent by God to preach in the northern kingdom known as the shrine of Bethel. As so often happens to the prophets, the priest wasn't pleased that he came.

Ephesians 1:3-14 Today and for the next few weeks, we will be reading consecutively from the letter to the Ephesians. Ephesus, a major seaport on the western coast of what is today Turkey, was a center for early Christians. Today's passage is the beginning of the letter and is a prayer praising God for the good things God has done for us.
